Drivers License date of 18 individuals accessed

Unauthorized lookup by two individuals discovered, stopped August 24

ST. PAUL, Minn. – The Department of Public Safety (DPS) and MN.IT Services, the State's IT organization, have discovered and stopped unauthorized viewing of Minnesota drivers license records.

DPS and MN.IT were able to determine that two individuals conducted 55 queries of the drivers license database from August 2 until the unauthorized access was discovered and stopped on August 24.

Through a forensic investigation, MN.IT was able to identify 18 people whose data was viewed without authorization. MN.IT continues its investigation to determine what other records may have been viewed, if any.

The data that may have been viewed included drivers license number, picture, name, address, and date-of-birth. Social Security numbers were not part of the query results.

There is no indication that the data was used for illicit purposes; however, DPS is recommending the affected individuals remain vigilant and review their credit reports on a regular basis. Letters informing the 18 people of the data breach are being mailed today.

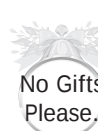

Deer lottery application deadline approaching

Firearms and muzzleloader hunters who want to harvest antlerless deer throughout much of Minnesota this hunting season are reminded they must purchase their license and apply for an antlerless permit by Thursday, Sept. 10, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources said.

Antlerless deer permits are issued by lottery in designated permit areas. Some areas that have not been in the lottery classification in recent years are in that classification this year, primarily as a result of new deer population goals.

"Hunters should review the hunting and trapping regulation book now," said Leslie McInenly, big game program leader with the DNR. "The lottery applies to over half of the state permit areas this year, and it's important to start planning for the season."

Hunters who want to participate in special firearm deer hunts also need to apply for permits that are issued by lottery, and the application deadline is Sept. 10. More information on deer permit areas and special hunts is in the DNR hunting regulations handbook, found online at www.mndnr.gov/hunting/deer.

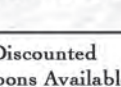

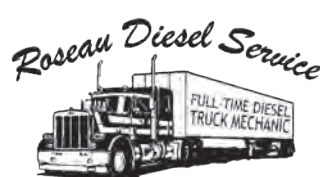

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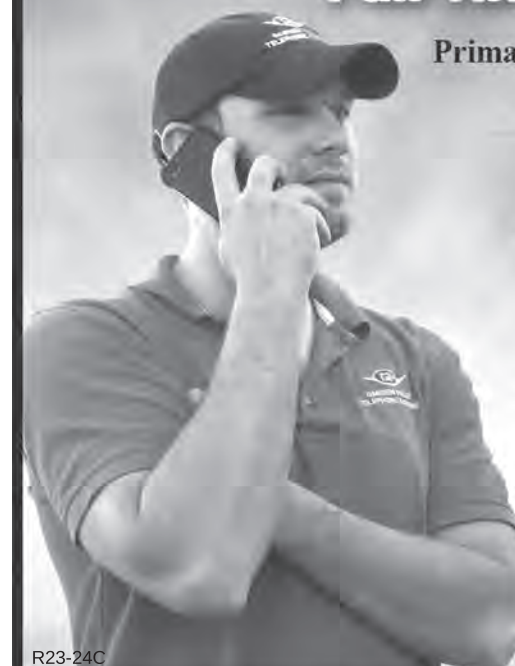

Your Firearms Questions Answered

This month's question is, "I have my carry permit and am looking for advice on getting a handgun that would be good for general use around the farm and occasional personal carry."

Choice of a handgun can be a very personal matter and there is as much brand loyalty as with vehicles. All branding aside, a general use handgun should be versatile, which means it may not always be ideal, but will be useful in a wide variety of situations. The most versatile handgun ever made is the double action .357 magnum revolver. For general use, a four inch barrel will be short enough to conceal but still long enough to keep the muzzle blast from getting too crazy. This revolver is capable of shooting light 38 special ammunition for practice or plinking, .38 +P or light .357 magnum ammunition for personal protection or pest control, and full power .357 magnums for hunting light game up to deer at short range. Revolvers are reliable with a variety of ammunition because they do not depend on the pressure to cycle the action. Semi-automatics will usually function reliably with ammunition of a particular pressure – usually at the higher end of the scale. This means a caliber powerful enough for hunting, like the 10mm Automatic, will be expensive and punishing for practice. Use of light practice loads in such a gun will require modification to function reliably. Once the gun is modified, shooting full power loads in it could be very dangerous. Obviously, lighter calibers are limited in usefulness because they are not very powerful. In

seeking the versatility of power offered by revolvers we give up a few good things. Revolvers are more bulky and carry fewer rounds than a similar sized semi-automatic. For personal protection around the farm that is usually irrelevant, but discrete carry will be more difficult.

For a person who prefers semi-automatics, a practical general use option would be a 1911 45 ACP, or a double action 9mm. The Glock's are nice if you don't mind plastic. I would stay away from the small frame semi-autos unless you are willing to put in some serious practice. Both the 45 ACP and 9mm Luger calibers are proven by time and experience. Both are light enough for comfortable plinking and practice, but powerful enough for personal protection. A disadvantage of the 45 ACP is ammunition can get expensive. If you are concerned about defense from black bear, a 45ACP with full metal jacket bullets would be a minimum, with the 10mm Automatic being better.

It is best to think about the most common and practical uses you will see and choose for that in mind. In a pinch, occasional needs outside the usual range of use can be met without too much trouble. And remember to spend some time practicing with your chosen handgun to become proficient. Until next time, keep both eyes open.

Ask a Trooper

Question: With the law of \$300 fines in construction zones, I have a question. I know the white and black speed limit sign is the legal speed limit. Are orange signs supposed to be advisory or warning signs? Can you get a ticket for going the speed of the white sign when there is also some orange signs posted? I've seen some construction zones with white and orange signs posted 55mph and then some orange signs with 35mph speed signs. What is the legal speed limit?



Answer: If you are cited for speeding in a marked and posted construction zone, the amount of the fine is \$300, and that does not include other fees that will be attached.

The white speed limit signs are the official regulatory sign. The orange signs serve as a warning; even though they are not regulatory, they are intended to provide clear instructions to help you drive safely. So if the posted speed limit is 55 mph, and you see an orange sign indicating 35 mph, I would recommend slowing to the indicated speed. The orange and black speed limit signs are not enforceable, but you could be issued a citation for failing to drive with due care in the event of a crash or near collision.

MS 169.14 Duty to drive with due care. No person shall drive a vehicle on a highway at a speed greater than is reasonable and prudent under the conditions. Every driver is responsible for becoming and remaining aware of the actual and potential hazards then existing on the highway and must use due care in operat-

ing a vehicle. In every event speed shall be so restricted as may be necessary to avoid colliding with any person, vehicle or other conveyance on or entering the highway in compliance with legal requirements and the duty of all persons to use due care.

Below you'll find a list of common traffic sign colors and their meanings:

- Red:** Almost always, red means stop. A red traffic sign either signals you to stop your vehicle or prohibits entry.
- Green:** Green means go. A green traffic sign signals that you can proceed, or provides you with direction on where to proceed.
- Yellow:** Yellow stands for caution. A yellow traffic sign serves as a general warning.
- Black and White:** Black and white traffic signs provide posted regulations (i.e., speed limits).
- Orange:** Orange signals construction time. If you see an orange traffic sign, you will likely encounter construction or road maintenance ahead.
- Brown:** Brown traffic signs reference local recreation areas or scenic points of interest.
- Blue:** Blue stands for guidance. Blue traffic signs often offer information to assist motorists.

Minnesota signs, signals, and pavement markings conform to the national standards.

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Minnesota fishing licenses made easy

"Hey, let's go fishing!" No license, no problem if you visit www.mndnr.gov/fishmn. No smart phone, also no problem, just call instant license at 888-665-4236. That's right, you can purchase your license online or via phone call and start fishing today, and it's that easy.



Licenses being readily available online or by phone support the Department of Natural Resources goal to make outdoor recreation more accessible to the public" said Col. Ken Soring, DNR Enforcement Division director. "Buying a license can take place wherever the person has cell phone coverage and no longer requires a trip to town."

From July 1-22, DNR conservation officers issued 89 citations for angling without a license which carries a fine of about \$185 plus restitution for any fish in possession and the fish will be forfeited. However, you can avoid those consequences and support fisheries and habitat management by purchasing an angling license

(resident adult season license is \$22, \$10 for a 24-hour license; nonresident adult season license is \$45, \$12 for a 24-hour license).

The DNR reports that online sales are on the rise. So far this year about 1-million licenses have been sold. Of that amount 9,513 were purchased on mobile devices. That compares to 2.3- million licenses sold in 2014, including 13,212 that were mobile license sales.

"The popularity and convenience of online shopping continues to increase and that's why the DNR has the 'shop DNR' link/Web Page," Soring said.

So enjoy a relaxing day of fishing and feel good about supporting Minnesota's fishing heritage, purchase that license, follow the regulations (which can also be found at www.mndnr.gov/fishmn), and help conservation officers protect natural resources by reporting violations at #TIP on cell phones or 800-652-9093.

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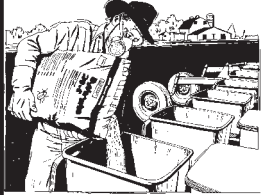
