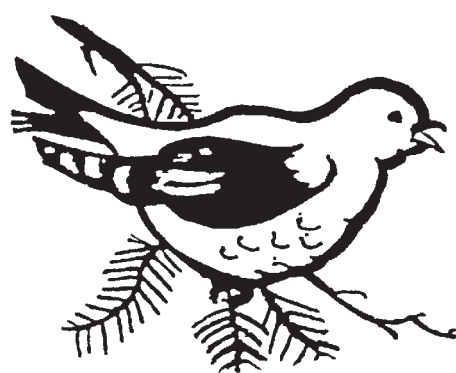
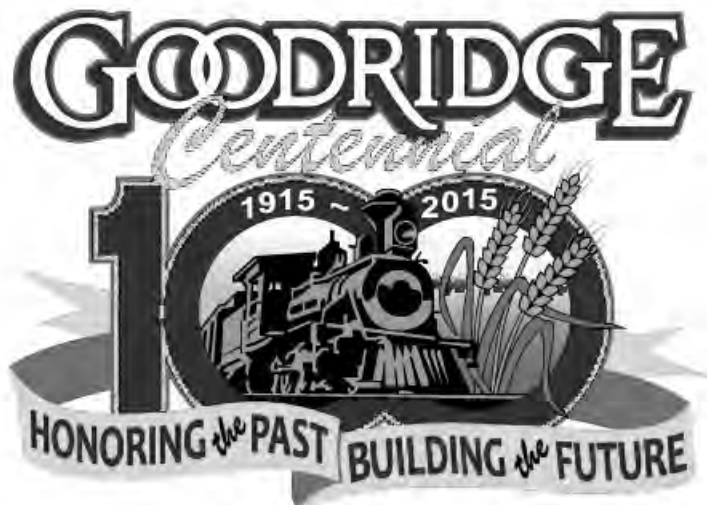

Goodridge gets ready to celebrate 100 years

The Goodridge Centennial celebration will be held July 3-5, 2015. A lot of work has went into planning an exciting and entertaining weekend full of events!

When the Goodridge Centennial Committee started meeting 3.5 years ago, they had no idea how fast the event would arrive. Thousands of volunteer hours have went into the planning and coordinating of the event and it couldn't have been done without the willingness and help from numerous volunteers in and around the community of Goodridge.

The Centennial Committee is headed by Shannon (Sjulestad) Moen and is made up of various sub-committees, including an All-School Reunion/Alumni Committee (Mary Ann Sjulestad), Beautification Committee (Margie Coan), History (Judy Jones), Entertainment (Jenny Jacobson, Shannon Moen).

We all know that getting people to volunteer and serve on committees can be tough, but the way Goodridge locals have pulled together to organize such an important weekend is pretty impressive. Chair of the committee, Shannon Moen, said, "It's been a lot of work...a lot of hard work...but we have tried to make it so people could be involved in an area that interested them. If someone loves to garden, they joined the beautification committee. If someone is a history buff, they offered their time and services in that area. We have had dedicated people putting in many, many hours of their time and it's all going to pay off!" Many of the committee members already volunteer their time elsewhere in the community, but with a little help from everyone, a fun-filled, busy and exciting weekend has come together quite nicely.

The intention of the 100-year celebration was to keep the birthday party free of cost to its attendees. Over three years ago, the committee was told to shoot for fundraising around \$50,000. The number seemed odd of reach at the time, but to date, all entertainment and events have been paid for through fundraising/sponsorship.

Fundraising activities have been a community wide effort. A couple of years ago, the town held a Harvest Ball in conjunction with a Harvest Hall. Folks were able to purchase a \$25.00 ticket to attend the ball, which included a steak feed, comedic entertainment and raffles. Over \$8,000 was raised from that event alone. The Harvest Hall exceeded all expectations. Area farmers (on a good year!) donated wheat and/or beans to raise dollars for the celebration. A semi went around to each farm and collected the donations and/or farmers were able to make note of whatever amount they so wished at the elevator. Moen said they had no idea what to expect from it and hoped for at least \$1,000.

When the "Harvest Hall" was all said and done, the elevator cut the committee a check for an impressive \$22,000!

That's what you call a community wide effort and all the hard work and time invested is sure to be noticed and enjoyed by all come July!

Operation Round Up donates nearly \$10,000...total since 1997 over \$325,000

A total of \$9,834 was donated by Operation Round Up on Tuesday, June 9 to various organizations in the area served by Clearwater-Polk Electric Cooperative, Inc. of Bagley. Since the co-op established Operation Round Up in 1997, over \$325,000 have been donated. According the Clearwater-Polk Manager Bruce Bjerke, approxi-

mately 80 percent of the co-op members participate in Operation Round Up by having their monthly electric bill rounded up to the nearest dollar, with the difference going into the bank for donations. 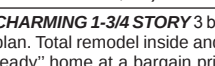

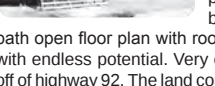

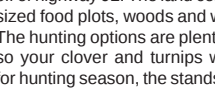

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## Theology in the Trenches

### Boundaries



Like any good parent, I read books on how to better understand my children. I like to know about the varying complexities of human relationships so as not to do too much psychological damage at any given moment to any given one. Unfortunately, when I was in the middle of the muddle, I didn't take as much time as I should have to do the reading which better equips. Basic survival skills were in order, but the one book I did manage to get under my belt had to do with strong willed children. Naturally, each one entering this world was marked from that moment on and truth be told, I'm not sure a one of em ever was...strong willed that is.

Now that they are grown and gone, I read about the things I did right. I read about the things I did wrong. And, I am currently reading a book entitled, "Boundaries" by Dr. Henry Cloud and Dr. John Townsend. Why am I reading a book about boundaries when my kids are out of the house? It's because I am trying to set boundaries in order to create healthy adults who are merging into traffic on their own. I don't want traffic jams, cause a wreck when one could have been avoided, and most of all I want to continue fostering healthy relationships with my adult children and their spouses.

If you really want to know, I am trying to give myself permission to have new vistas which may or may not have anything to do with the lives of my children. Ask any mom out there... it's tough to give yourself permission to focus on areas that do not include them. Grand central station was never my forte, and

now that the season has passed, I'm rather enjoying the quietude. It gives one just a bit more time for reflection needed to maintain healthy.

"Boundaries" helps me look back while at the same time enables me to look forward. It's helping me understand some of the reasons why I did what I did and why I do what I do. One illustration within the pages likened a child to a tree and how various things can affect its growth. ## Ask a Trooper

by Sgt. Jesse Grabow of the Minnesota State Patrol

Question: I've noticed there appears to be two light bulbs/lamps near the rear license plate. Is it required to have both lights on your license plate working or is it alright if only one light is working? Is it illegal if your license plate light or lights are out?

Answer: Most new vehicles are equipped with two rear license plate lamps. Some older models have only one. Minnesota State Statute 169.50 Subd. 2 says; "Either such rear lamp or separate lamp shall be so constructed and placed as to illuminate with a white light the rear registration plate and render it legible from a distance of 50 feet to the rear. Any rear lamp or rear lamps, together with any separate lamp for illuminating the rear registration plate, shall be so wired as to be lighted whenever the headlamps or auxiliary driving lamps are lighted."

A reminder that all license plates must be:

- (1) Securely fastened to pre-



vent them from swinging.

(2) Displayed horizontally with the identifying numbers and letters facing outward from the vehicle.

(3) Mounted in the upright position. The person driving the motor vehicle shall keep the plate legible, unobstructed, and free from grease, dust, or other blurring material so that the lettering is plainly visible at all times. It is unlawful to cover any assigned letters, numbers or the name of the state of origin of a license plate with any material. That includes any clear or colorless material that affects the plate's visibility or reflectivity.

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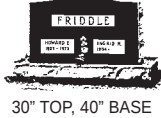

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### Highway 2 and Highway 89 intersection reconstruction begins June 15

Motorists on Highway 2 and Highway 89 near Bemidji may encounter slow traffic, lane closures, flaggers and delays as a project to reconstruct the intersection begins June 15. Residents and business owners are encouraged to attend a bi-weekly open house beginning Thursday, June 11 to learn more about the project.

The informal open house begins at 6 p.m. in room 151 at the Bemidji MnDOT building, 3920 Highway 2 West. They will take place every other Thursday and allow those attending to view displays, learn how the project may affect their travel and get questions answered directly from contactor representatives, MnDOT staff and other project officials.

Highway 2 will be reduced to single lane traffic in both the eastbound and westbound lanes throughout the project and a two-day detour is planned for later in the process to allow for the setting of bridge beams. Motorists on Highway 89 will experience temporary lane closures and then will be detoured after the new Highway 2 bridge beams are installed. The exact timing of the detours are unknown at this time, but are expected to take place in mid-August.

KGM Contractors Inc. is the contractor for the \$4.8 million project, which is expected to be complete in October, weather permitting. It will result in a safer intersection with improved turning lanes, intersection

lighting, and an overpass for motorists on Highway 89 to access the eastbound lanes of Highway 2.

MnDOT urges motorists to follow these recommendations in work zones: stay alert; watch for signs, equipment and workers; minimize distractions, such as using cell phones, eating or drinking; avoid tailgating; follow posted speed limits and directional signs; and stay in one lane while driving through a work zone.

### DNR advises public to let wildlife remain wild

This is the time of year when young animals are scampering about lawns, roadsides and just about everywhere else in Minnesota. However, it is important leave these animals alone, according to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources.

Birds are falling out of their nests and many types of wild baby animals can be mistaken as abandoned or lost. In reality the mother is probably not too far away and will soon return.

"People should always leave wild baby animals alone unless it is certain that the mother is dead or the animal is seriously injured," said Dave Rave, DNR Bemidji area wildlife supervisor. "The parent is almost always nearby."

Most deer fawns are born in May, and within hours of birth the fawn is led to a secluded spot so it can nurse. With a full stomach, the fawn is content to lie down and rest. If the doe has twins, it will hide the second fawn up to 200 feet away. Then the doe leaves to feed and rest herself, out of sight but within earshot.

"While a new fawn may appear helpless, it's important to keep your distance and not interfere with the doe's natural instinct for raising its young," Rave said. "Leave fawns alone and let wildlife remain wild."

Many small animals like rabbits attend to their young just a few minutes a day and intentionally stay away from their young to avoid drawing the attention of predators. If the animals are extremely young and have been removed from the nesting site, return them to the nest as soon as possible, Rave said.

Birds should be handled the same way. Sometimes nests fill up as the birds grow, and young birds get crowded out before they are ready to leave. These birds will usually do fine because they will be fed by their parents on the ground. Only very young birds without feathers should be picked up and returned to the nest. People should not worry about getting human scent on young birds when plac-

ing them back in the nest because birds have a poor sense of smell.

Rave also said people should contain their dogs and keep cats indoors during this time of year. Curious pets can disturb or harm young and nesting animals, adding to fatalities.

"Many people do not know what to do when they find an injured or orphaned animal," said Rave. "The process is very difficult and intense. Rehabbing wildlife can be complex. Many hand-raised animals are not good candidates for release back into the wild."

People should never attempt to raise wild birds or animals themselves. It is against the law for anyone to keep wild animals without proper training and DNR licensing. In captivity, most wild animals are fragile, traumatize easily and have

complex nutritional needs. They can die suddenly.

Some wildlife species have naturally high mortality

rates even when cared for by their parents, but the populations continue to do well despite these losses.



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
