Renovations complete at Cornerstone Nursing & Rehab Center in Bagley

Cornerstone Nursing & Rehab Center has now completed their renovation of their facility in Bagley. They held an Open House to let people see what they have done with the Therapy Addition, Memory Care Addition and the new furnishing, Refreshments, door prizes and a chance to greet the residents and staff was held on Thursday, December 8.

Cornerstone Nursing & Rehab Center in Bagley is one of four units owned by the same Board of Directors. The other three are Cornerstone Residence of Kelliher, Cornerstone Residence of Fosston and Cornerstone Residence of Bagley.

The Cornerstone Nursing & Rehab Center opened their Rehab Department in February of 2015, their Memory Care unit in May of this year and in October they finished their renovations of the facility next to the Golf Course in Bagley. This unit has the capability for 43 residents living in a single room with private bath.

Last Thursday Allen Potvin owner of Cornerstone Nursing & Rehab and representatives from Miller Architects & Building from St. Cloud and Terry Matson from Security State Bank in Bemidji were there for the Open House that was held. Dave Tebrake and Andrew Goulet are part of

the St. Cloud Company that has been in business for more than five generations. They do everything from start to finish including development, architectural and construction services.

The Board of Directors had

done a needs assessment in Clearwater County in 2008 to determine if an Assisted Living Community was needed to meet the needs of Clearwater County. In addition to providing Skilled Nursing and Rehab, the Board saw there was a need to

expand their services to include Assisted living. In 2009, a 37 apartment assisted Living Community building was built along Highway 2 to provide health related and support services to the Cornerstone Resident of Bagley.

Red Lake Watershed District's Jesme named 2016 Outstanding Watershed Employee of the Year

St. Paul, Minn., - The Minnesota Board of Water and Soil Resources (BWSR) is pleased to announce that Myron Jesme, District Administrator for the Red Lake Watershed District, has been honored as the 2016 Outstanding Watershed District Employee of the Year.

Myron began working for the Red Lake Watershed District in 2003, having previously worked for 20 years for what was then known as the Middle River-Snake River Watershed District. As district administrator, Myron is the key point of contact for the largest watershed district in the state. A leader in the region, he has successfully developed and maintained positive relationships with state and federal agencies, the Red Lake Band of Chippewa Indians, multiple local units of governments, non-governmental organizations, and the public.

Over the years, those relationships have been key to the Watershed District's ability to get projects on the ground.

Myron has been instrumental in the completion of multiple large-scale District projects, one of the most impressive of which was the \$7.25 million restoration of the Grand Marais Creek Outlet, completed in late 2015. Conservation projects with numerous stakeholders and multiple funding sources can be difficult to manage, but Myron's careful stewardship of the project and inclusion of multiple partners on the project team helped ensure success.

Myron has also been a true leader in the One Watershed, One Plan (1W1P) program, and has served on the Local Government Roundtable, which was foundational in the program's development, for many years. Myron is an active member of the Red Lake River 1W1P pilot program planning work group and advisory committee. He brought recommendations to the policy committee, worked with the watershed district board to provide financial assistance, and led the planning grant application for the Thief

River watershed.

"Myron's work has made a positive impact on the Red Lake Watershed District and throughout the state," BWSR Executive Director John Jaschke said. "He's demonstrated time and

time again the value of partnerships and a commitment to going the extra mile to make sure his projects succeed."

The Outstanding Watershed District Employee of the Year is awarded at the Minnesota Association of Watershed Districts' convention, held annually in December.

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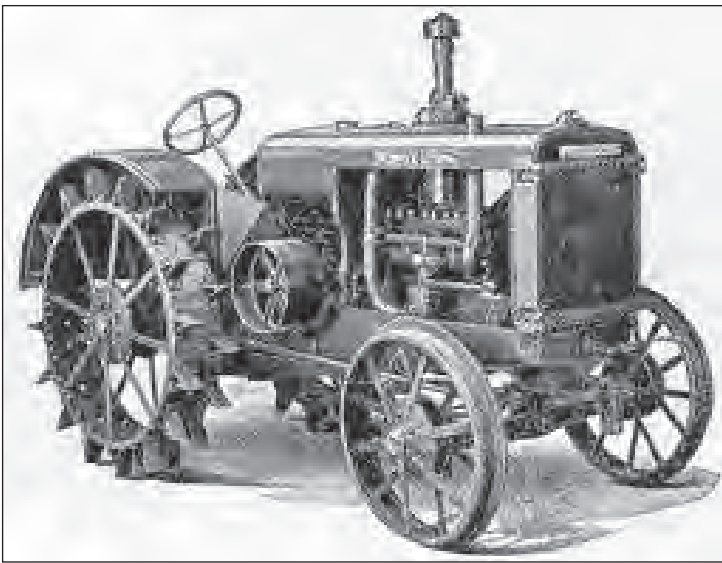
Good Old Cyrus McCormick

In 1831, Cyrus McCormick produced a successful reaper for harvesting grain. It was a simple contraption, but definitely was a huge step up from swinging a scythe all day in the wheat field. Cyrus moved west from Virginia to the mid-west to show his invention to farmers on the prairie. He built his factory in Chicago, IL, which would be the future home of International Harvester. Now you know I love tractors and I love history so I had to insert this tid-bit of IH history. Mrs. O'leary's cow tried to put an end to the McCormick reaper. In 1871 the McCormick reaper factory was destroyed in the great Chicago fire. Shortly afterwards a newer bigger factory was built!! In 1902 the McCormick Harvesting Machine Company of Chicago, Deering Harvester of Chicago and three other companies merged and the International Harvester Company was born!

This early history was an interesting beginning to a company that would eventually bring us a great line of tractors!! Early tractors included the Titan and the Mogul but as time went on the McCormick Deering 10-20, and 15-30 helped the company make it's mark in the tractor industry. Of course the Farm all design tractors really gave the company what they need to be a leader in tractor sales. The F series of tractors, F-12, F-14, F-20, and F-30 proved to be the tractors other companies had to try find an answer for. But, the reason I wanted to talk about McCormick Deering this week was the "W" series of tractors.

The W-12 was the standard tread version of the row crop F-12. The one that has caught my eye in magazines and videos is the W-40. The W-40 came out in 1934 and featured 6-cylinder power. The big standard tractor is impressive in stature. Later the WD-40 was added. This was the first diesel powered wheel driven tractor manufactured in the United States. I would love to sit down between those big

fenders and plow all day. I know you old timers who did exactly that may disagree with me.....but, I'd prefer to bounce around all day with 2, 3, or 4 bottom than watch a movie as the tractor steers itself!! Ask a Trooper

Question: Often I have noticed cars that can't be seen because they do not have lights turned on making them invisible. It is my understanding that when over forty years ago Sweden made it illegal to have a car's motor running without the lights on, car accidents

dropped by 30%. If something as simple and inexpensive as this saves lives, why doesn't the USA have such a law? One would think that the insurance companies would demand it.

Answer: I have no current data on the history and statistics from Sweden. I agree with you that being seen while driving can help reduce your chances of being involved in a crash. Law enforcement enforces the current laws and driving rules that are in place. I have seen many of the newer model vehicles that have daytime running lights that are on when the vehicle is in motion, and I believe this does help reduce the chances of being involved in a crash.

Basic automatic headlights work through sensors which detect how much light is outside. These sensors are located on the dash of the vehicle. The headlights turn on when the sensors detect a certain level of darkness or the level of ambient light. Most vehicles retained the conventional headlight switches, which allow drivers to turn lights on or off and bypass the sensors.

There are limitations to automatic headlights. Sometimes they do not turn on during heavy rain or fog, as the light sensor still detects some light.

Many drivers fail to physically turn on their headlights, which will also activate the rear taillights and marker lights. Drivers might assume the sensors will activate all of the ve-

hicles lights in reduced visibilities, but that is not always the case.

Minnesota law basically says that every vehicle on a roadway shall display lighted headlamps, lighted tail lamps, and illuminating devices from sunset to sunrise and at any time when it is raining, snowing, sleeting, or hailing or at any other time when visibility is impaired by weather or insufficient light, at a distance of 500 feet ahead.

A good rule to follow is if your wipers need to be on, then your headlights, taillights and marker lights should be on too. You are right that it is very important that you can be seen and not just what you can see. When lights are required, manually turn on your headlights and you will know for sure that all your lights will be on when needed. Also, make it a habit to check your lights often to make sure all of them are working properly.

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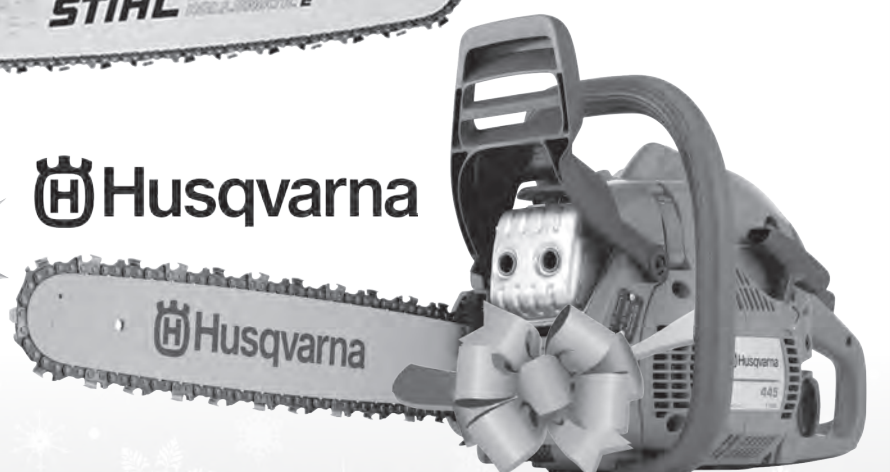
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
