CROOKSTON, Minn. – The University of Minnesota Crookston will host the 42nd annual Ag Arama on Friday and Saturday, January 27-28, 2017. This year's Ag Arama is dedicated to Associate Professor Margot Rudstrom and the theme for the weekend is "Better in Boots."

Most of the Ag Arama activities take place on Saturday, January 28, in the University Teaching and Outreach Center (UTOC) located on the north edge of the campus. Everyone is invited to attend.

Contests in agronomy, animal science, horticulture, agricultural business, and natural resources highlight Ag Arama weekend. They serve as an opportunity for students to showcase their knowledge and skills and have a chance to interact with alumni and faculty members. Ag Arama is planned and operated by a committee of students advised by Terrill Bradford and Brenda Miller, who both teach in the Agriculture and Natural Resources Department.

On Saturday morning from 8:30 a.m. until 12:30 p.m., the animal

showmanship contests begin and the public is welcome to watch the competition as it unfolds in both novice and experienced categories. At 1:30 p.m., the Round Robin Showmanship will begin followed by alumni showmanship at 2 p.m. Coronation of the Ag Arama royalty takes place at 2:30 p.m. followed by the presentation of specialty awards and the sweepstakes presentation.

Polk County Sheriff

On 01/15/2017, the Polk County Sheriff's Office received a report of a snowmobile accident in Knute Township just east of the City of Erskine. At approximately 2053 hours, a passerby called the Sheriff's Office and stated they observed a snowmobile that appeared to have crashed on 350th St. SE, Erskine.

Deputies responded and did not locate anyone in the area. A 1999, Arctic Cat, ZR 600 EFI was still at the scene. The operator of the snowmobile was later located and had sustained minor injuries from the crash. The snowmobile sustained moderate damage.

The operator was identified as Sofrony Kutsev, age 33 years of rural McIntosh. Mr. Kutsev was cited for operating a snowmobile on a state trail without having a snowmobile safety certificate.

The Polk County Sheriff's Office was the only agency responding to this incident. No further information is being given out at this time.

Crookston man wins \$100,000 Lottery prize

ROSEVILLE, Minn. (Jan. 11, 2017) – Bob Prudhomme of Crookston had been holding onto a \$100,000 winning Lottery ticket for almost two months.

Prudhomme finally stepped forward on Jan. 9, 2017 to claim a \$100,000 prize that he won in the All or Nothing evening drawing on Nov. 15, 2016 by matching all twelve winning numbers drawn.

While it took him a while to claim his prize, it didn't take him long to discover his ticket's worth. Prudhomme found out

shortly after the drawing that his ticket was a winner.

“It initially started out as a joke, he recalled. “When I heard the store sold a winner, I said, ‘I bet you that’s me.’” Sure enough—it was. “I was still pretty shocked,” he said. M & H Gas, located at 315 N. Main St. in Crookston, sold the winning ticket. The store will receive a \$1,000 bonus for selling the winning ticket.

Prudhomme plans to invest some of the winnings in his lawn care business, Bob's Lawn Care in Crookston.

“It was worth coming down here for,” he said as he claimed the prize at Lottery headquarters in Roseville.

Lottery players have won more than \$6.5 billion. All Minnesotans are winners because more than \$2.7 billion in lottery proceeds have helped our state—more than \$1.1 billion has helped preserve, restore and protect Minnesota's environment in each of the 87 counties and almost \$1.5 billion has helped fund state programs including education, public safety and health & human services.

America's largest animal circus closes after 146 years, ADI calls on all circuses to end wild animal acts

Animal Defenders International (ADI) has welcomed the announcement by Ringling Bros. Barnum & Bailey Circus to close its animal shows from May, citing declines in ticket sales after earlier announcing a 'mood shift' among their consumers. After decades of exposing the cramped, barren conditions with long periods of time tied up and chained with no freedom of movement and a brutal training culture, ADI believes that public opinion has ended the suffering.

Modern audiences now have many entertainment options and do not want to see shows where animals are made to suffer for a few minutes of entertainment.

Jan Creamer, ADI President, said: “After decades of exposing the suffering of animals in circuses behind the scenes, we are pleased to hear that Ringlings has finally bowed to public opinion – it was a mistake for them not to see the trend away from animal shows to human-only performances over a decade ago. Circuses can survive without the animal performances.”

ADI is supporting Representatives Ryan Costello (R-PA) and Raul Grijalva (D-AZ), who launched Traveling Exotic Animal and Public Safety Protection Act (TEAPSPA) in Congress last November. The congressmen have concluded that ending wild animal use is the only practical approach to deal with public safety issues and inspection and oversight problems repeatedly cited by the Office of the Inspector General (OIG).

Studies of the use of wild animals in traveling circuses show that in the circumstances of a traveling show, circuses cannot meet the needs of wild animals. Animals are confined in small spaces, deprived of physical and social needs, spending excessive amounts of time tied or chained up, shut in transporters and unable to move around. The abnormal, stereotypical behaviors seen in circus animals, rocking, swaying and pacing, indicate that they are under stress and not coping with their environment. ADI's video evidence has shown how these animals are forced to perform tricks through physical violence, fear and intimidation.

Ask a Trooper

Question: If a person with a CDL (Commercial Driver's License) gets a DWI in a private, personal vehicle. The test level that applies is .08 or more and he will lose his regular driver's license but not the CDL, correct?

Answer: The legal limit for driving impaired in Minnesota is 0.08 — but motorists can be arrested for DWI at lower levels. The consequences for driving impaired will vary for each DWI offender. A typical penalty for a first-time offender is the loss of a regular license for a minimum of 30 days or possibly up to a year, and possible jail time. Costs of a DWI can be as high as \$20,000

when factoring court costs, legal fees and increased insurance premiums.

For those with a CDL, a first DWI conviction in any vehicle would result in a loss (disqualification) of the CDL for one year. A second DWI conviction would result in the loss a CDL for life. After ten year, if they can show rehabilitation a person could possibly get their CDL back.

Minnesota's enhanced DWI enforcement and education efforts have been factors in the continued reduction of alcohol-related deaths. Still, drunk driving remains a serious threat, contributing to 95 deaths in 2015. There were more than 25,000 motorists arrested for DWI in 2015, and one in seven Minnesota drivers has

a DWI on record.

The fight against impaired driving is everyone's responsibility. If a person plans on consuming alcohol, plan ahead for a sober ride. If you see an impaired person about to get into a vehicle, speak up and find that person a safe ride home.

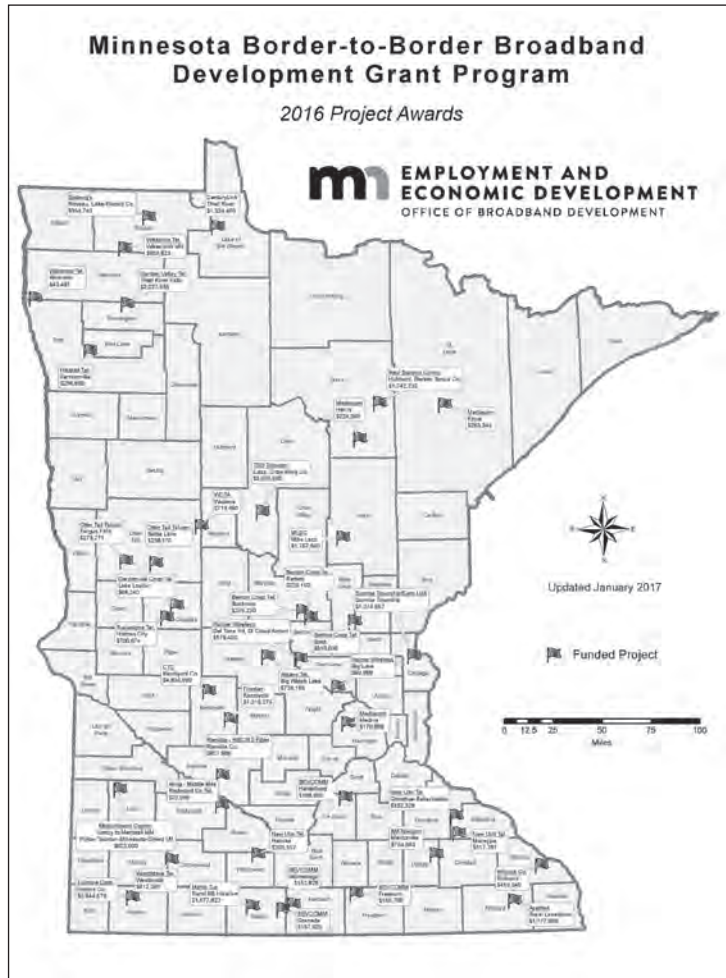
