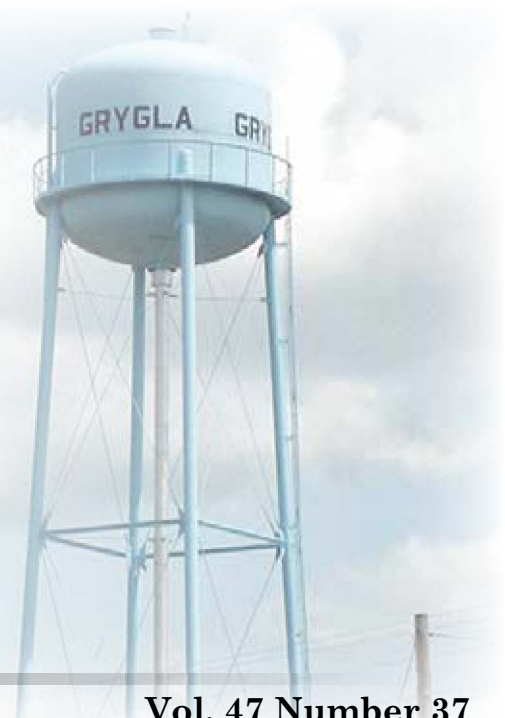

Marshall County Sheriff's Office Dispatch-Jailer Job Opening
The Marshall County Sheriff's Office is accepting employment applications for the position of Jailer-Dispatcher. This position starts out at (\$22.46) for day shift and (\$25.46) for night shift. After 6-months the wages go up to (\$23.01) for day shift and (\$26.01) for night shift and after 1 year of employment the wages go up to (\$23.77) for day shift and (\$26.77) for night shift.
This position works 12-hour shifts. The shifts are from 6:00 am – 6:00 pm and 6:00 pm –6:00 am. Shifts include working holidays and weekends. If an employee works on a holiday, they receive 12 hours of overtime pay. There are always 2 dispatchers/jailers on at all times. The employee needs more than 3 days in a row.
The Marshall County Sheriff's Office has an excellent benefit package. If the employee takes a family stipend health insurance plan, they are given \$1,550.00 towards the premium. If they elect a single health insurance stipend, they are given \$870.00 a month towards the premium. If a spouse has health insurance, the employee is given \$870.00 per month. That would make each paycheck \$435.00 more. Each employee accrues 4 hours vacation and accrues 4 hours of sick time each pay week. There are 26 pay periods in a year. On top of vacation hours each employee gets 92 hours of holiday hours they can use as vacation hours.

Student Loan Forgiveness – Diving into the Fray
It's been a while since I took out a student loan. No matter how you look at it, college is an expensive proposition. Personally, I had SOME scholarship money. I had SOME grant money, but it wasn't enough to carry me through. Student loans were the only way to reach the finish line for my teaching degree.

So, what did I do? I took out the loans and I slowly paid them back. On a teacher's salary. That's what people do in the real world.

My loans were modest. I wasn't at a big-time college. Moorhead State University provided me with a very adequate education. Tuition was reasonable and I worked part-time playing bass guitar in a band. The student loans weren't mammoth, but they simply hung over my head until I was gainfully employed in a full-time job.

I got a teaching position right out of college, so I was able to begin the process of repaying the loans. It was painful, but that's what people do in the real world. If I remember correctly, the pain of student loans was done and gone in five years.

So, why are so many of today's college students drowning in debt? Why should we throw them a life preserver? I paid back my student loans. Should they not be able to pay

back their loans, as well?

Suddenly, the rules changed. The late 1900s were not kind to colleges. Budgets were cut. Revenue streams diminished. Colleges have only so many sources of revenue without the benefit of big-pocket donors. Tuition kept going up, and up, and up.

But tuition rates are just one piece of the puzzle. Scholarships and grants aren't as readily available on the academic front. (Big-time sports at big-time universities is a whole different situation – Let the March Madness begin.) Inflation reduces buying power in all areas of society. Big-name schools = big name bucks. High level programs = high level costs. Make sure you add the Pandemic in for good measure.

So, the question of the day is: Do we forgive student debt? Follow that question up with: What do you want our future society to look like?

First, we need to get the verbiage correct. Student loan forgiveness is a misleading name. We should be calling for an investment in our future by allowing college students to begin their lives with the removal of the ankle bracelet of loans that keeps dragging them down. The world needs teachers, and nurses, and law enforcement, and fire fighters, and a myriad of other critical professions. Speaking as a former educator, we need incentives to put people into professions that

"Joe Public" takes for granted. So many of these areas are currently at a tipping point.

Second, this doesn't necessarily have to be a "black hole money-pit." Loans could be incentivized by mandating the recipients are actively working in their field of study. Working as a nurse for five years = a reduction in student loan debt. An income tax credit could achieve the same thing. Creative options can do wonders to erase the stigma of "loan forgiveness."

Third, we must consider Big Picture Outlooks. Education and nursing are already in crisis, not to mention environmental and climate change issues. We live in a society. Societies fix problems or risk the catastrophic meltdown of their very being. Fix it or lose it is not being overly dramatic.

So, while I paid off my college student loans, I think systemic changes can be made to help today's struggling students. I don't begrudge this necessary endeavor. We need to think long-term as a society. Recently, my generalist doctor at Mayo Clinic moved to Alaska. How does this apply here? The proposal offered by the hospital was a full-time job with the additional incentive of 5 years of service to wipe out all of her medical loans. It's time to think outside the box.

If you believe the value or classification of your property is incorrect, please contact your assessor's office to discuss your concerns. If you disagree with the valuation or classification after discussing it with your assessor, you may appear before the local board of appeal and equalization. The board will review your assessments and may make corrections as needed. Generally, you must appeal to the local board before appealing to the county board of appeal and equalization.

The hardest part about suppers is choosing what to make. This recipe caught my eye because everything is done in one skillet and ready in 30 minutes – my kind of meal!
Chicken Chow Mein
This chow mein comes together in minutes. Saute your chicken then toss with cooked chow mein noodles, sauteed cabbage and carrots. Lastly, everything gets tossed in an easy stir fry sauce.
8 ounces chow mein noodles
8 ounces boneless skinless chicken breasts, sliced into thin strips
2 tablespoons oil, divided
3 cups green cabbage, sliced
1 cup carrots, thinly sliced
2 teaspoon ginger, minced
3 cloves garlic, minced
green onions for serving, if desired
sesame seeds for serving, if desired
desired
Sauce
4 tablespoon low sodium soy sauce
2 tablespoon oyster sauce
2 teaspoons sesame oil
1 tablespoon brown sugar
Prepare noodles according to package instructions. In a small bowl combine the sauce ingredients, set aside. Heat 1 tablespoon oil in a large skillet. Add in chicken and cook until golden brown and cooked through, 5-6 minutes. Remove from the pan and set aside on a plate. Add remaining tablespoon of oil to the same skillet. Add cabbage and carrots and saute until golden brown and wilted, 2-3 minutes. Add garlic and ginger and cook for an additional minute. Add in cooked noodles and sauce tossing to coat the noodles. Serve immediately with green onions and sesame seeds on top, if desired.

100-200 elk roaming northwestern Minnesota

Between 100-200 elk roam northwestern Minnesota, likely a mix of descendants of elk reintroduced to the wild by Minnesota DNR in 1935 and natural elk immigration from Canadian herds. There are three main herds located in Minnesota: the Grygla herd, the Kittson Central herd, and the Caribou-Vita (aka Kittson Northeast) herd.
The Grygla herd is believed to be descended from elk captured in northwest Wyoming, and a few animals from a private farm in Ramsey County, MN (also descended Wyoming stock) in the early 1900s.
The Kittson Central herd descended from elk that immigrated from Manitoba. This herd is located near the city of Lancaster. Elk were first noted in Kittson and Roseau counties along the Manitoba border in the early 1980s and these animals naturally shifted their range south (wildlife do not recognize human borders).
The Caribou-Vita (aka. Kittson Northeast) herd is found in the northeast corner of Kittson County in Caribou Township. This herd moves back and forth between international boundaries.
Each winter we conduct aerial surveys to gather minimum count estimates of each herd. This data enables the DNR to monitor the elk population's long-term trends, document changes in their territory and sex ratios, and to help set harvest quotas for elk hunting seasons. In 2023 we were fortunate to be able to complete an aerial survey on the Manitoba side of the international border. Results from this winter will be posted online as part of the 2023 Elk Survey Report.

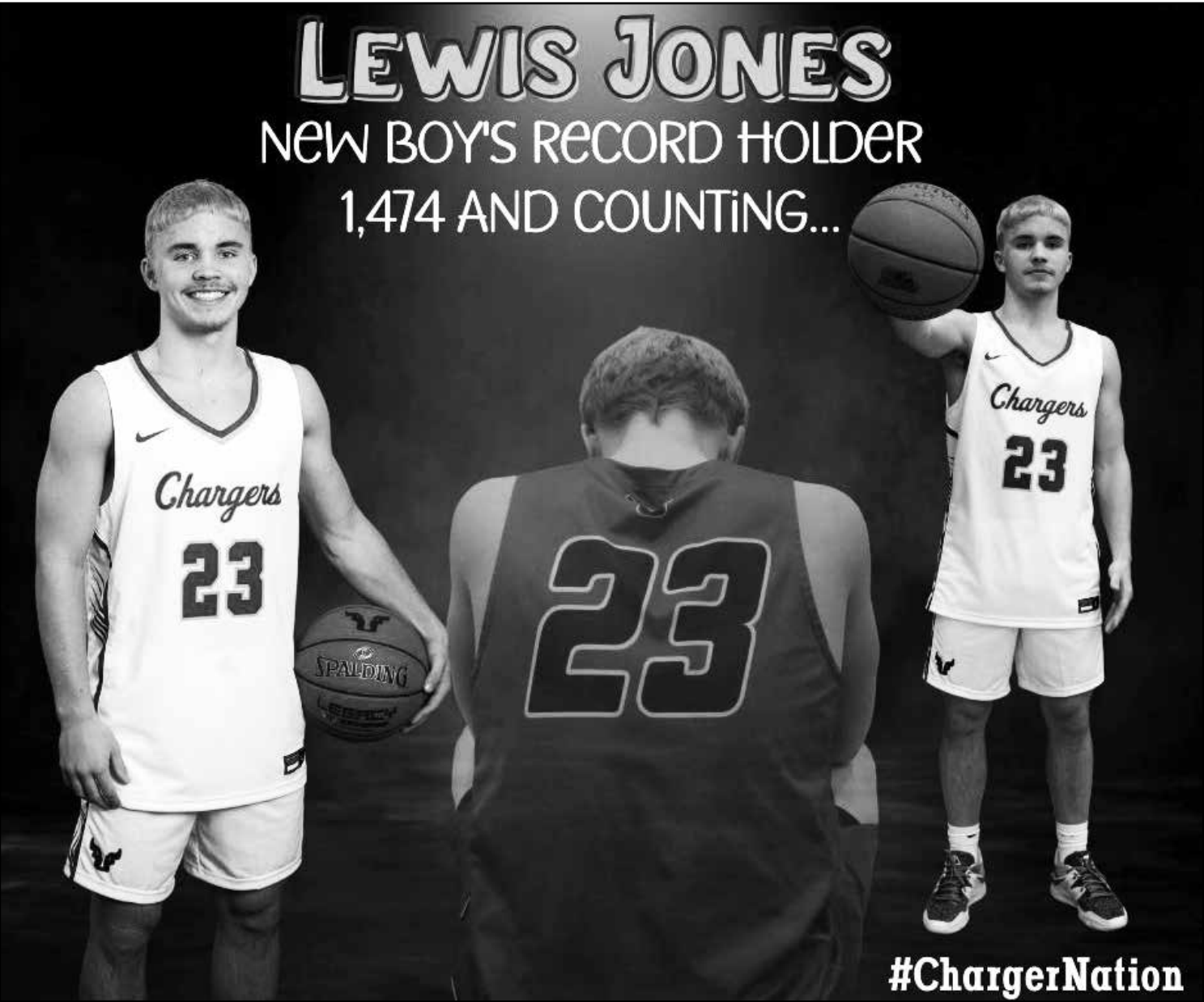
Deadline to remove ice shelters in northern Minnesota is March 20

MN DNR reminds anglers that the upcoming deadline to remove ice shelters from lakes in the northern one-third of the state is quickly approaching. Heavy snow and slush in some areas means conditions on the ice might be challenging; plan ahead to ensure you're able to meet the deadline.
The removal deadline in the northern one-third of the state — which is defined as north of the east-west line formed by U.S. Highway 10, east along Highway 34 to Minnesota Highway 200, east along Highway 200 to U.S. Highway 2, and east along Highway 2 to the Minnesota-Wisconsin border — is by 11:59 p.m. Monday, March 20. The removal deadline for Minnesota/Canada border waters is March 31.
