River of Dreams canoes launched

On May 18th, students from Grygla in Abby Sundberg's 4th grade class launched their River of Dreams canoes into the Mud River. The International Water Institute's River of Dreams program engages students to better understand their watershed through reading, writing, art, and geography. Students experience virtual tours of their watershed, see where their local river flows, and visualize its watershed. The students decorated a trackable, 14" cedar canoe and wrote a dream for its river journey. A web page is created for each canoe which includes the date and location of launch along

with a picture of the canoe and "dream" story. Canoes found by area residents can be logged into the database by following instructions and recording the unique ID number which accompany each canoe.

View decorated canoes, read dream stories, and see where they are discovered at www.riverofdreams.org.

Funding for this program was provided by the Red Lake Watershed District as a member of the Red River Watershed Management Board and the MN Legislative Clean Water Fund.

Basin-wide Education

River of Dreams reached 1,500 students at 44 schools across the Red River Basin this year. This program starts with each classroom reading Paddle-to-the-Sea (Holling C. Holling, 1941) that follows a small canoe on its own river journey with the dream of 'paddling to the sea'. Elementary students are able to imagine their own canoe flowing downstream and learn river terms such as headwaters, tributary, confluence, and mouth.

International Water Institute's River Watch program has been active in Red River Basin high schools since 1995. River Watch Students collect water

quality data, explore rivers from the seat of a kayak, identify macroinvertebrates, and share information with their peers. Currently there are 25 active River Watch Teams and more than 300 River Watch students in the Red River Basin.

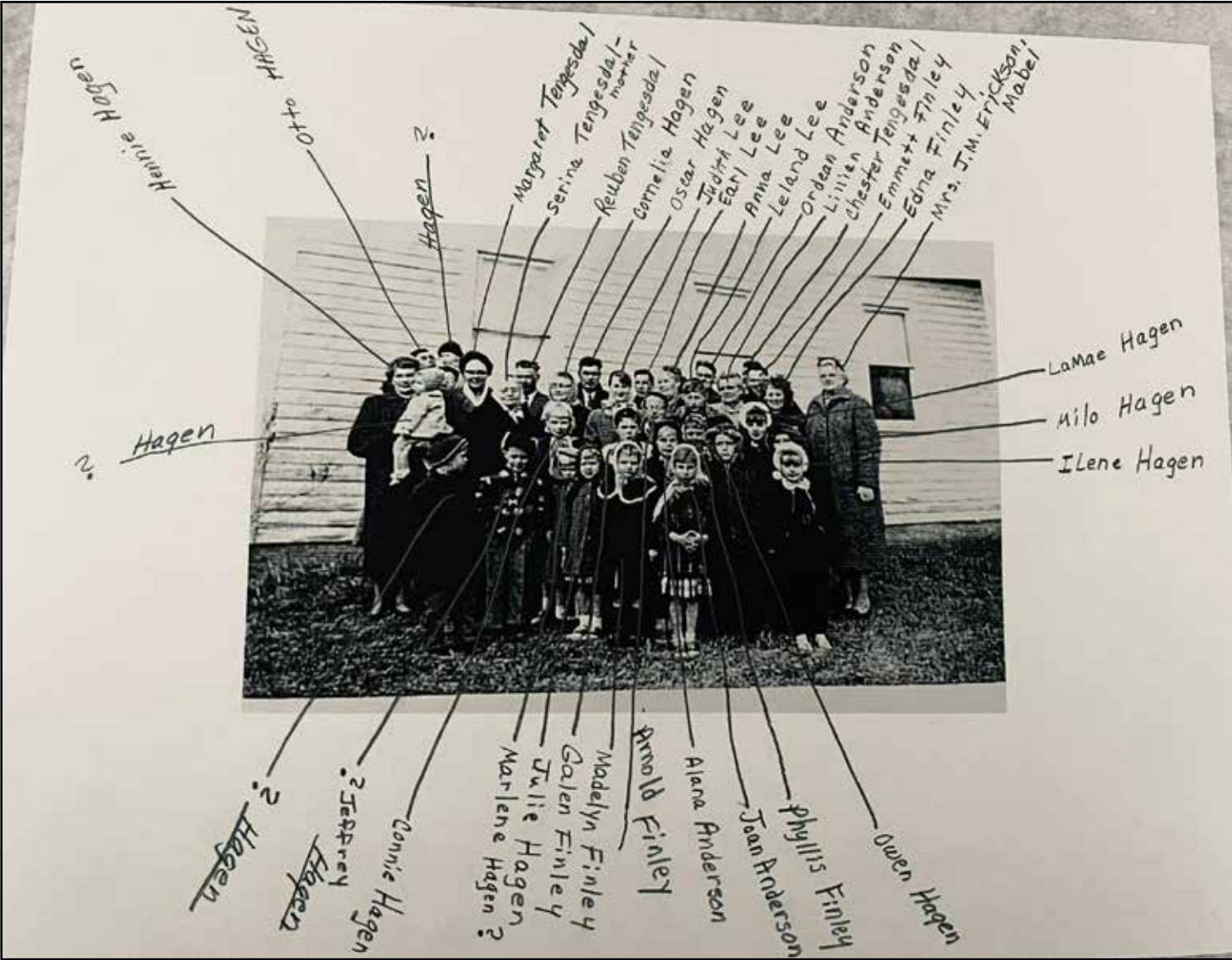
Northwood Church Reunion

Apply through June 16 to hunt elk in Minnesota

Elk hunters have through Friday, June 16, to apply for one of 17 elk licenses offered this year by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources. Seasons will run from early September to mid-October. Hunters can choose from two license options. One license is for an antlerless elk, which can be a female or a young male. The other license option is for either a bull or antlerless elk. Hunters should review the elk

season structure on the DNR website (mndnr.gov/hunting/elk) prior to entering the lottery to ensure they apply for the license they want.

New this season, the DNR expanded the boundaries of Elk Zone 20 near Lancaster to better encompass areas where elk have been during elk hunting seasons. The zone expanded by about 6 miles to the west and 3 miles to the south.

GENERAL NOTICE OF ROADSIDE DITCH SPRAYING ALONG COUNTY ROADS

Beltrami County will be performing roadside vegetation control along Beltrami County Highways starting June 5th. We will be spraying for Spotted Knapweed, Thistle, Tansy, Wild Parsnip, and brush. The following roads within Northwood township will be sprayed: Hagen, Whitewolf, Morel and Wapiti. The following roads within Big Grass township will be sprayed: Powderhorn, Phentom and Pine Island. County roads 700, 701, 702, 703, 704, 705, 706, 707, 709 and 710 will be sprayed also. We are putting out this notice because you may have property adjacent to the roadside scheduled for treatment. Selective herbicides will be used that control the brush and noxious weeds but allow the grass to grow. All herbicides have been fully tested and are approved by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the Minnesota Department of Agriculture. If you do not want spraying adjacent to your property you **MUST** place "DO NOT SPRAY" signs at the beginning and end of your segment. 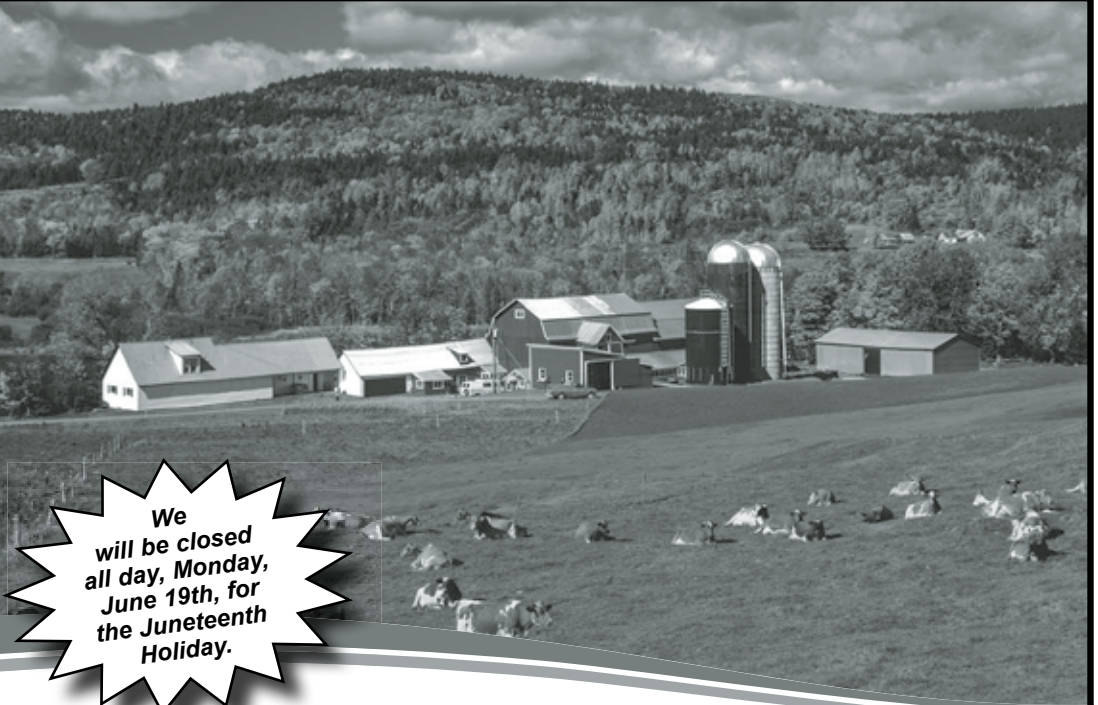

Did you know that Minnesota is home to many notable places of worship? For example, the Basilica of St. Mary in Minneapolis is the oldest Basilica in the United States. Likewise, the largest Buddhist temple in the United States is found in rural Hampton, Minnesota. These places are beautiful and impressive. Of course, there are many smaller places of worship that are also worth noting, too, but we'd like to introduce yet another notable place. Angels of the Prairie is a beautiful country chapel in Minnesota that will inspire you like nowhere else.

Angels of the Prairie is a beautiful chapel in rural Minnesota. More specifically, it's in Isanti County, near the small town of Cambridge. In the summer months, it is a botanical garden with many beautiful plants in bloom.



The chapel is on the grounds of a lovely, lush space complete with a small pond. And in the winter, it may be decorated for Christmas or covered in a blanket of snow. This charming chapel looks like something out of an old-time movie.

The chapel is full of charming details. It was built in the style of pioneer churches from centuries ago. Inside, it's even more beautiful. Many details come from the historic Zion Norwegian Lutheran Church in Towner, North Dakota, built more than 120 years ago. This includes the set of beautiful stained glass windows that cast a magical glow on the chapel's interior. The 14-foot-tall altar comes from the same church. It includes an original oil painting from 1926. This chapel is a wonderful place to pray, reflect, or simply take in the peaceful rural surroundings and simple beauty. It's one of the most unique places to visit in Minnesota.

Honey Chipotle Chicken Rice Bowls

These Honey Chipotle Chicken Rice Bowls are topped with the most delicious sweet and spicy grilled chicken and avocado corn salsa. They're hearty, healthy, and perfect for weeknight dinners.

- Ingredients
- Honey Chipotle Chicken
 - 1 pound boneless skinless chicken breasts
 - 1 tablespoon olive oil
 - 1 chipotle Chile in adobo sauce + 1 tablespoon of adobo sauce, finely chop the chipotle
 - 1/2 of a lime, juiced
 - 1 tablespoon honey
 - 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
 - 1/2 teaspoon ground cumin
 - 1 tablespoon chopped fresh cilantro
 - Salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste
 - Avocado Corn Salsa
 - 1 cup grilled fresh corn or defrosted frozen corn
 - 1 avocado, peeled and diced
 - 1 jalapeño, seeds and vein removed and finely diced
 - 1 tablespoon chopped cilantro
 - 1/2 of a lime, juice
 - 1/2 teaspoon ground cumin
 - Salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste
 - Other Ingredients
 - 2 cups cooked rice
 - Crumbled queso fresco or cotija cheese
 - Lime wedges and cilantro for garnish

Instructions

Honey Chipotle Chicken

Whisk together the olive oil, chipotle, adobo sauce, lime juice, honey, garlic powder, cumin, cilantro, salt and pepper in a bowl or glass measur-

ing cup. Add the chicken to a freezer bag and pour in the marinade. Seal the bag and massage the marinade into the chicken. Let the chicken marinate for at least an hour and up to 4 hours.

Preheat grill or skillet to medium-high heat (about 400-425° F. on the grill). Oil the grill grates or skillet and add on the chicken breasts. Cook for about 5-6 minutes on the first side and then flip them over and grill until the internal temperature is 165° F.

Remove the chicken from the grill and let it rest for 5-10 minutes before dicing or slicing it.

Avocado Corn Salsa

In a bowl add the corn kernels, diced avocado, jalapeño, cilantro, lime juice, cumin, salt and pepper. Stir everything together and taste it for seasoning.

Assembling the Bowls

Divide the rice evenly into the bowls. Top the rice with some of the chicken, salsa, and cheese. Garnish with extra cilantro and a lime wedge.
