Horse shot in pasture near Gatzke

Alyssa Aune, of Gatzke, shared that her horse was shot last week on Wednesday night right before 11:30pm in her family's horse pasture near Gatzke. She says three gun shots were heard by the horse pasture, which is also by their house. In the morning, the horse, Parker, was found with his front leg shot off and had to be put down. Aune says her family is devastated. Anyone with information in the case is being asked to call the Marshall County Sheriff's Office at 218-745-5411.

Aune is also asking if anyone along Highway 89, stretching from all the way to Fourtown/Grygla to Wannaska area, has any type of driveway camera pointed towards the highway. If so, please reach out.

Aune's have also offered a reward of \$2500 to anyone who can provide information that leads to the successful prosecution of the individual(s) responsible for this crime. Aune shared, "Your courage to come forward can make a significant difference."

Of her horse, Aune shared that Parker was not just any horse.



She said, "Parker was an absolute saint. Truly one of the best. He did everything for anybody, and never gave a bad ride. If you have ever been to the PBR Thunder On Hooves Bullride at the Thief River Falls Fair in the past, you probably saw Parker carrying flags. Horses like him are one in a million. He was to become my niece's first horse, but sadly she will never get to ride him now. Saying goodbye to a horse in their last days is something, but saying goodbye to a horse who had its leg shot off in a senseless act is traumatic. I will forever have that moment etched into my brain and it will haunt me for the rest of my life. Stay vigilant, and if you see or hear anything, please speak up. If it can happen to us, it can happen to anyone."

Folks have reached out to the Aunes wanting to donate towards a reward. A GoFundMe account has been created at <https://go-fund.me/bacf0723> and an account with Border State Bank titled "Gatzke Horse Reward" has also been set up if anyone wishes to contribute.
