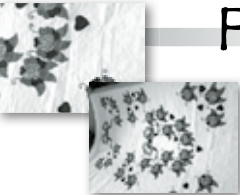

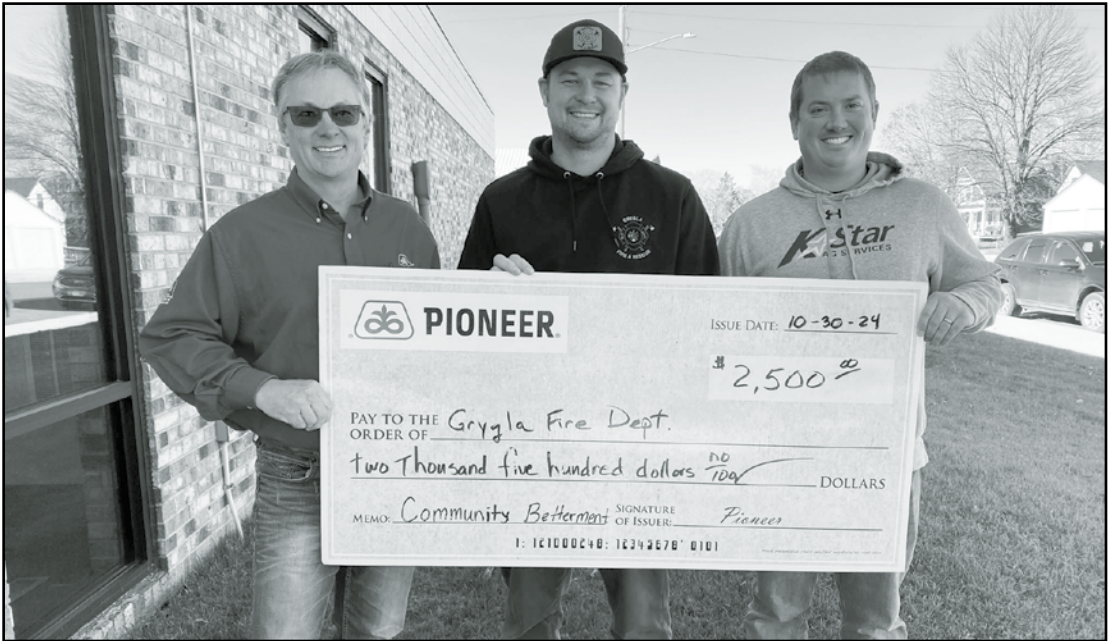

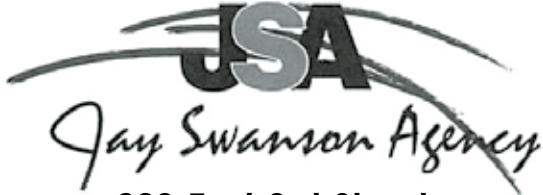

Only in Minnesota: a weekly feature in the Eagle

Minnesota Hwy. 1 is the longest road in the state highway system, and it's one of the most scenic drives in Minnesota. Along its course, there are many, many things to see along MN Hwy 1. It spans the widest section of the state, from Lake Superior to the Red River, traversing national forests, skirting state parks, crossing Native American reservations, and treating drivers to some of the Bold North's most majestic scenery.

Scenic Hwy. 61, on the North Shore of Lake Superior, is Hwy. 1's eastern terminus.

It begins at Illgen City - a near ghost town - within the boundaries of Tettegouche State Park. Head west, ascending the Sawtooth Mountains. Look for the trailhead to Illgen Falls in Tettegouche State Park. It's about two miles from Hwy. 61, and a short hike - literally a few hundred feet - will bring you to a pristine cascade

on the Baptism River.

Continuing west, Hwy. 1 passes through the Superior National Forest and the small communities of Finland and Isabella. Keep your eyes open - this stretch of road rolls through some of Minnesota's prime moose country.

After a little more than 60 miles, the road passes through Ely. The charming town started as a fur trading post but gained permanence during a mining boom in the late 19th century. Today, it's a gateway to the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness. Traveling south and west from Ely on Hwy. 1, you'll pass near Bear Head Lake and Lake Vermilion-Soudan Underground Mine State Parks. Past Tower, the road skirts the southern shore of Lake Vermilion, through Cook, and across the Bois Forte Band of Chippewa reservation.

A stop at Scenic State Park - voted one of the country's best

- is a must. Hike Chase Point Trail, which follows the tree-lined esker that separates Coon Lake from Sandwick Lake.

The highway traverses the Chippewa National Forest and passes near The Lost 40. The Lost 40 is a stand of old-growth white and red pine trees that weren't logged due to a surveying error. The grove is co-managed by the Minnesota DNR as a scientific and natural area and the U.S. Forest Service.

Leaving Chippewa National Forest, Hwy. 1 approaches State Hwy. 72 just north of Blackduck. Blackduck is the northern terminus of the Lady Slipper Scenic Byway. The byway passes through some of the state's most orchid-friendly landscapes and offers drivers ample opportunity to enjoy the flowers when they're in bloom.

As you travel westward, Hwy. 1 will bring you to Red Lake, the largest lake completely within Minnesota's borders.

Hwy. 1 skirts Lower Red Lake and passes through the Red Lake Ojibwe Nation. But consider a detour north, along the east side of the lake, to Big Bog State Recreation Area, where you'll find the largest peatland bog in the Lower 48 states and many other recreational opportunities on Upper Red Lake.

Moving away from the Red Lake area, Hwy. 1 crosses into the aspen parklands biome of northwestern Minnesota, where elk herds have been reintroduced.

One of the best places to spot elk is near the Agassiz National Wildlife Refuge, just north of Hwy. 1. The refuge is also a perfect final stop on your journey, and it's only about 60 miles from Hwy. 1's western terminus in the town of Oslo on the Red River.

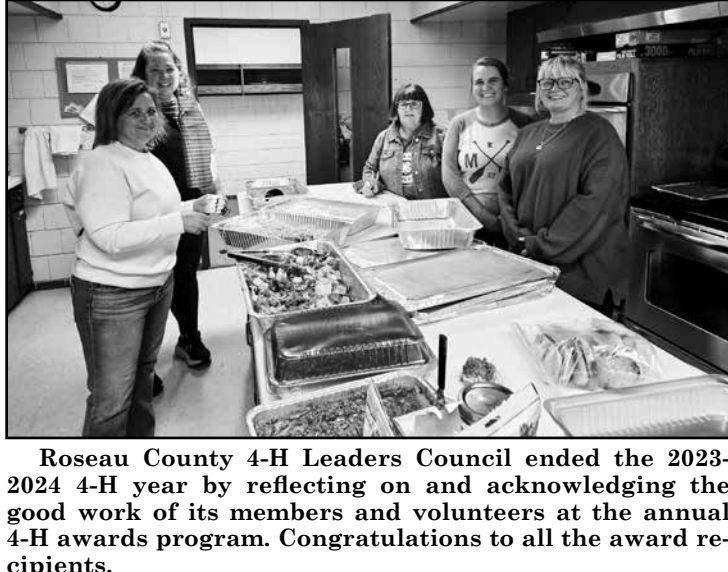

SIMPLY DELICIOUS

Creamy Parmesan Italian Sausage Soup

It's sweater weather, ok? Which also means it's soup season. Yeah! Bring on the cozy nights at home. This is a quick & flavorful recipe that's so comforting on these darker, cooler nights, too.

1 lb. Italian Sausage, browned & crumbled
1 tbsp. olive oil
1 small onion, chopped
3 cloves garlic, minced
4 cups chicken broth
1 can (14.5 oz.) diced tomatoes
1 cup heavy cream
1 cup grated Parmesan cheese
2 cups baby spinach
1 tsp. Italian seasoning
½ tsp. crushed red pepper flakes
Salt & pepper to taste
Pasta or gnocchi, optional

In a large pot, heat olive oil over medium heat. Add Italian sausage and cook until browned, breaking it up with a spoon, but leaving in larger pieces. Drain fat, if necessary. Add chopped onion and

minced garlic to the pot, cooking until onion is translucent (about 3-4 minutes).

Pour in the chicken broth, seasonings and diced tomatoes, bring to a simmer. If you choose to add pasta or gnocchi, add that now, cook according to package instructions.

Once the pasta is cooked and tender, add baby spinach and cook until wilted, about 2 minutes. Turn the heat to low. Stir in heavy cream, grated Parmesan cheese and Italian seasoning. Simmer for 10 minutes, stirring occasionally, until the soup becomes creamy and smooth.

(For a thicker soup, add a tbsp. of cornstarch mixed with a tbsp. of water.



Deadline for Individual Artist Grants is coming soon

Applications are open for arts grants to individuals from our seven county Minnesota service area including Kittson, Marshall, Norman, Pennington, Polk, Red Lake, and Roseau counties.

This year both the individual Artist Grants for \$5,000 and \$1,500 have a November 15 deadline. Quick turnaround grants for \$500 are also available on an ongoing basis. These grants are awarded to performing artists, visual artists, media artists, and creative writing artists from our seven county Minnesota service area including Kittson, Marshall, Norman, Pennington, Polk, Red Lake, and Roseau counties.

Individuals must be out of high school and at least 18 years of age to be eligible. College tuition is not an eligible expense. This is the main category that individuals use to support their artistic business or advance their technical skills. This category is for non-hobby artists who make substantial yearly income from their art. Grants are awarded annually with \$1,500 going to four individuals and \$5,000 going to four individuals. Support for this program comes from The McKnight Foundation.

Individuals absolutely must reside in our region (for one year prior) and remain living in our region during your entire grant year (2025). In the case of college students, your school or your home mailing address must be in our region. You will have to show proof of residency, usually your driver's license.

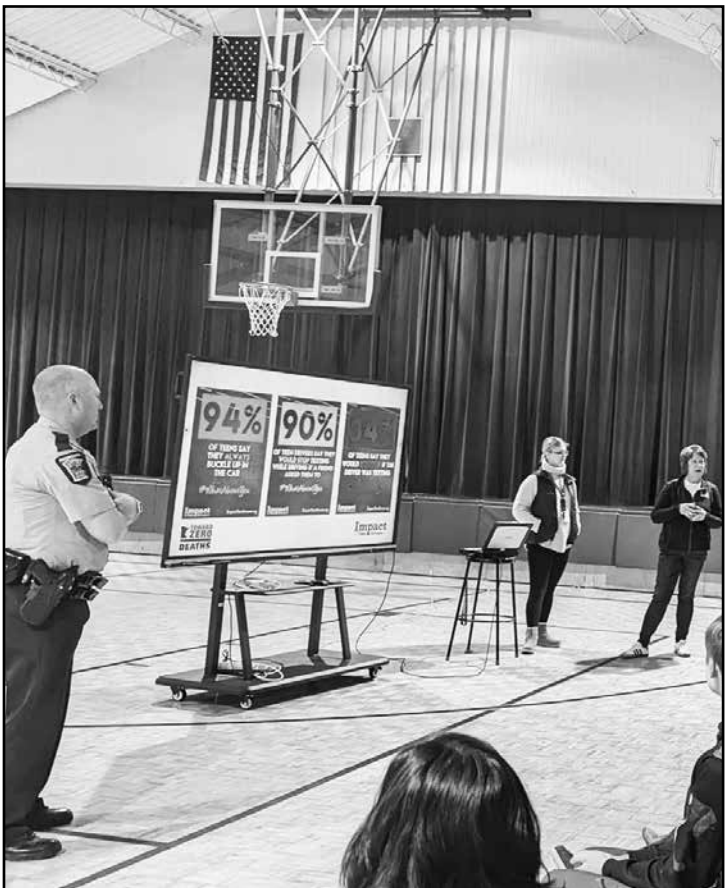

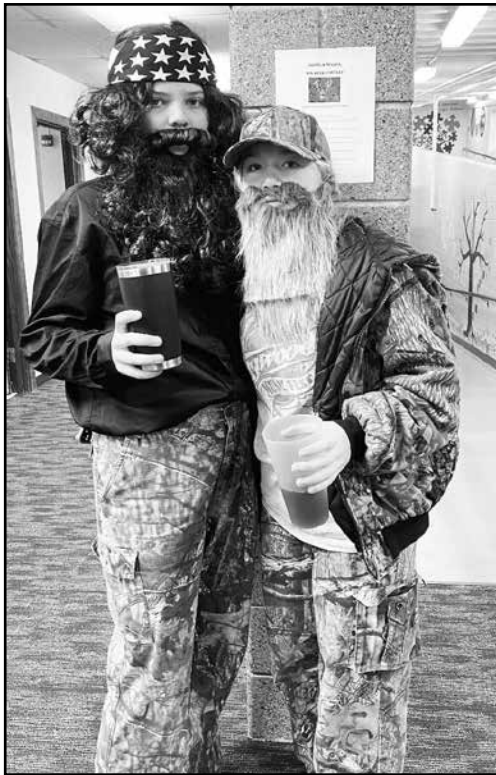
Grygla School: Halloween dress-up & carnival fun
