Free entrance to Minnesota state parks and recreation areas this Friday

Minnesotans encouraged to explore outdoors with friends and family over the holiday weekend.

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources is waiving entrance fees to all 73 state parks and recreation areas the day after Thanksgiving, Friday, Nov. 29. This "Free Park Day" is one of four days each year when the DNR waives the requirement for a vehicle permit for state parks and recreation areas. The goal of Free Park Days is to encourage Minnesotans to get outdoors and enjoy the health and wellness benefits of spending time in nature.

"During the hustle and bustle of the holiday season, Minnesota state parks and recreation areas are the perfect places to enjoy the tranquility of nature," said Ann Pierce, director of the DNR Parks and Trails Division. "We encourage people to get outside with friends and family after Thanksgiving gatherings to enjoy the calming sights and

sounds of nature. With cooler weather, quieter trails, and unique wildlife activity, visitors can experience Minnesota state parks and recreation areas in a new light."

Many published studies show the positive physical and mental health benefits of spending time in nature. According to the American Psychological Association, the calming and restorative qualities of nature help lower cortisol levels, which leads to reduced stress and improved cognitive function.

Outdoor recreation options in late November include hiking, biking, nature photography, birdwatching and wildlife watching. Even though peak fall colors have passed, late fall offers scenic vistas and peaceful trails. This time of year is perfect for spotting birds and wildlife that are easier to see after the leaves have fallen from trees. Look for deer and foxes that are more active in cooler weather, and waterfowl along lakes and rivers. Visitors are encouraged to

plan ahead and arrive prepared for their visit.

- Check visitor alerts and find directions on state park webpages (mndnr.gov/park-list).

- Download the Avenza app and the geoPDF map before the trip. The app and maps are free, and maps will display a user's current location even when not connected to the internet or cell service. Find information on the DNR's geoPDF map webpage (mndnr.gov/geopdf). Visitors without a smartphone should look for paper maps outside the ranger station.

- Visit the information signs near the park entrance for suggestions on what to see and do in the park.

- Check the weather forecast before leaving home, and dress appropriately for the conditions. Be sure to pack water and snacks.

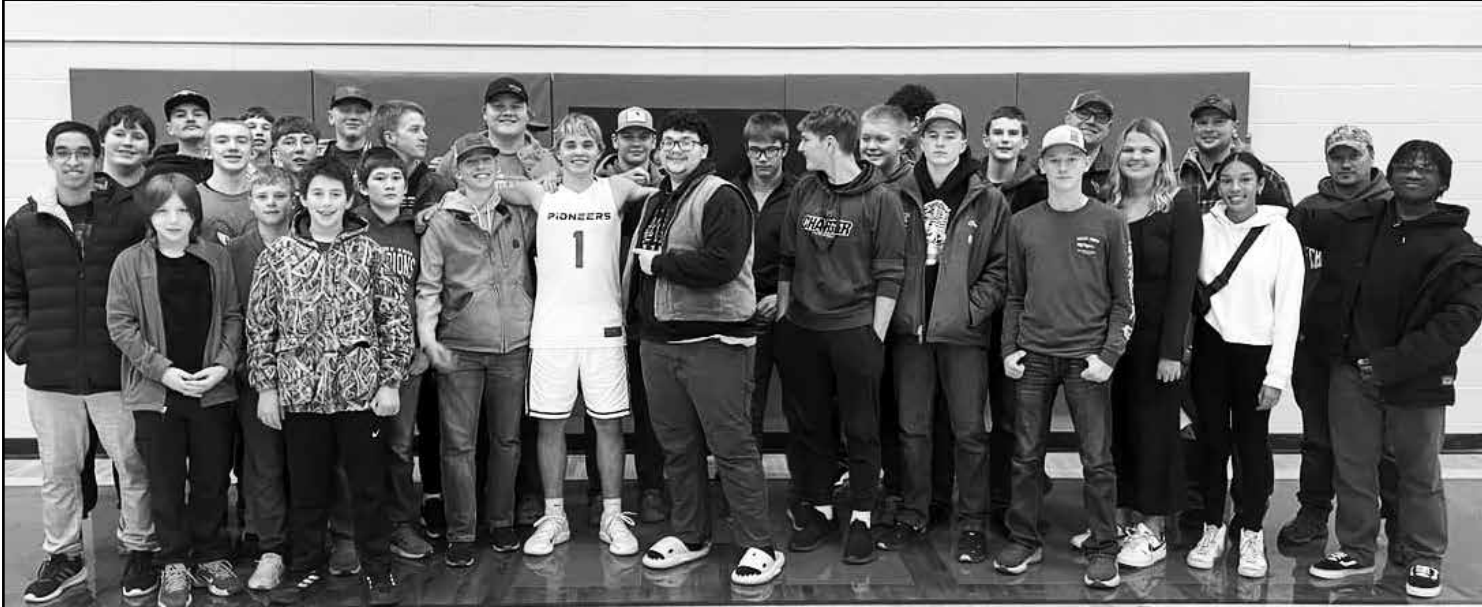

Cheesy Mashed Potato Puffs

These Cheesy Mashed Potato Puffs are crispy on the outside, fluffy and cheesy on the inside—a perfect way to use up all those leftover mashed potatoes from Thanksgiving!

Ingredients

2 cups mashed potatoes (leftover or freshly made)

1 cup shredded cheddar cheese

1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese

2 large eggs

1/4 cup milk

2 green onions, chopped

Salt and pepper to taste

1/2 teaspoon garlic powder

1/2 teaspoon smoked paprika (optional)

Instructions

Preheat your oven to 400°F and lightly grease a muffin tin.

In a large bowl, combine the mashed potatoes, cheddar cheese, Parmesan, eggs, milk, green onions, garlic powder, smoked paprika, salt, and pepper. Mix well until smooth and

creamy.

Spoon the potato mixture into the prepared muffin tin, filling each cup about three-quarters full.

Bake for 20-25 minutes, until the tops are golden and the puffs are set.

Let cool slightly before removing from the muffin tin. Serve warm and enjoy the cheesy, fluffy goodness! Perfect for a snack, side dish or appetizer.



Holiday Train rolls into the area

All aboard! The Canadian Pacific Holiday Train will stop in 20 Minnesota towns on its annual ride through the northern U.S., bringing live entertainment and Christmas cheer in exchange for donations to local food banks.

It'll be arriving in Thief River Falls on Sunday, December 15th, at roughly 7:45pm, stopping at 405 2nd Street East near the old depot.

The Holiday Train is a great way to get into the festive spirit. It's about 1,000 feet in length with 14 brightly decorated rail cars. Each one is lit with hundreds of thousands of LEDs and holiday designs celebrating the spirit of the giving season.

Depending on the day, visitors can enjoy free musical performances by The Lone Bellow and Tiera Kennedy or Seaforth and Alana Springsteen. Any

food or cash donations will also benefit the local community.

Please note: You don't actually get to ride the Holiday Train. It's more of a pop-up concert experience. The train arrives and pulls to a safe stop in front of the crowd. The stage door lowers and the band opens with its first song, followed by a brief presentation with the local food bank officials and other dignitaries on stage. Once the presentation is done the band resumes the show, singing a mix of traditional and modern holiday-themed songs, and popular original songs. After the final song the boxcar door closes and the train is on its way to the next stop."

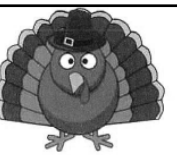
