DNR urges people to leave deer fawns alone

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources asks that people avoid disturbing or touching deer fawns, which are born around this time of year.
Most fawns are born in mid-May to mid-June. Fawns do not attempt to evade predators during their first few weeks of life. Instead, they remain still to avoid being seen. During these times, fawns are learning critical survival skills from their mothers but are often left on their own while their mothers forage watchfully nearby.
Be assured deer fawns are likely fine even if they look abandoned or fragile. Even if the fawn is known to be wounded or abandoned due to car strike or animal attack, do not transport it without talking to a wildlife rehabilitator. Moving a fawn can be detrimental to the animal and increase the risk of disease spread. For more information about what to do when people find fawns or other species of young wild animals, visit the Minnesota DNR website (mndnr.gov/eco/non-game/rehabilitation/orphaned-wildlife.html).

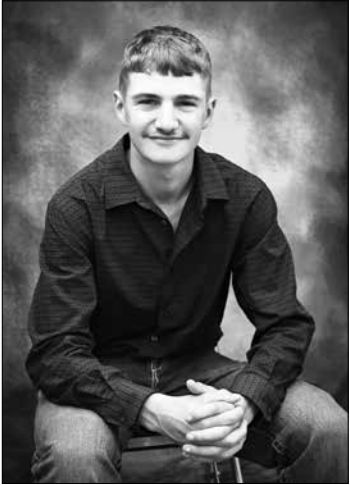

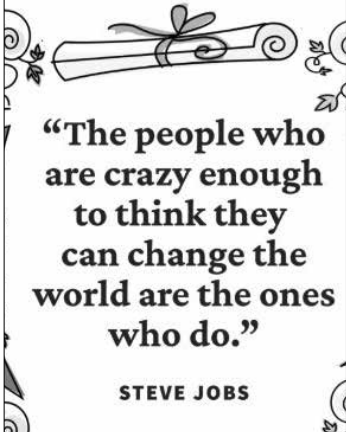

Student artists shine at regional exhibit

Two talented art students earned top honors at the Northwest Minnesota Arts Council Exhibit held Sunday, April 27th, in Crookston.
Addison Severts received third place for a sculpture piece, earning a \$100 award. The work was also selected for the prestigious Traveling Art Gallery (TAG), a regional exhibit featuring 14 pieces (seven by adults and seven by students) from the seven-county Northwest Minnesota area. The TAG collection will travel

to various libraries throughout the region over the next year. All pieces will be returned to their artists at the 2026 Annual Awards Ceremony.
Autumn Osse was awarded a merit recognition and received \$50 for her photography piece. Her work was also selected for display in Senator Mark Johnson’s office in the Twin Cities. Only five student pieces are chosen for this honor each year. These works, too, will be returned to their artists in 2026.

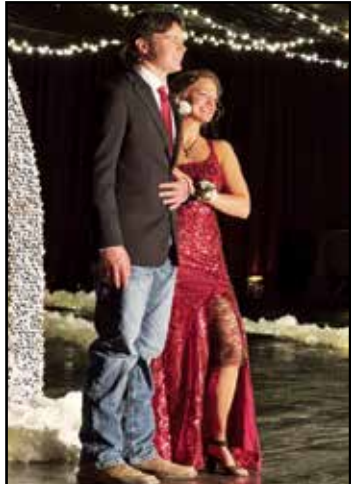
