Jessica Horn, Executive Director of Pine Ridge (DAC/ Stop, Shop, Drop Thrift Store, remarked that Ginger is very compassionate, always willing to help, and very knowledgeable about the needs and wants of the residents. Jessica continued, "if Ginger decides to retire, it will leave a huge hole, never being able to replace her due to her knowledge and understanding of the residents disability. Ginger was working during the transition from the state hospital systems to community based care back in the late 80's

early 90's."
Heidi LaFontaine, Direct Services Support Supervisor at Pine Ridge said, "Ginger is fun to be around when we work and is a great teacher."
Gladys Lueken, former Resident Assistant, and current board member said, "Ginger had no children of her own, and all the residents became her family. Ginger and her late husband Marvel dedicated their lives to the health and happiness of all the residents over the years."

It's clear Ginger is very humble. All she could really say was the "clients are the whole thing!" Ginger did say, of the 40 years, Covid was the most challenging. Residents were unable to have any physical interaction with family nor could they go on outings. Additionally, office workers couldn't have physical interactions with the residents either. This went on for nearly two years. Staff had to get creative with indoor activities, as well as getting IPADs so the residents could interact with family.

Clearbrook-Gonvick School ready for the first day

Superintendent Ryan Grow at the Clearbrook-Gonvick School Board meeting on Monday, August 21 stated that the district was ready for the first day of school. All students will be in attendance on Tuesday, September 5th. The teaching staff is at full capacity. There are a couple of extra curricular winter sports coaches that have not been filled.

The school has had a teacher mentor program with older staff members working with some of the five new first year teachers. Grow mentioned that staff should be compensated for their time.

He is looking at the language with the new legislative laws and trying to decipher the intent. The school district 12 year long term plan was approved by the MD. Repairs are needed in the north and south parking lots and they will hold off on the crack sealing until next summer. The Industrial tech car is going up on the on-line auction with McMullen. Eide Bailey was at the school and everything went well with the audit. The PTO on the Tool Cat is not working. The City of Clearbrook came in and mowed half of the campus lawn to get ready for the school year.

ATSR was coming in with a marketing team to take photos and to interview on different projects that they will address for the referendum link on the internet. Proposed options include a gym addition, SPED additions, Secure Entry, Media and small group space additions and repairs & building betterment would cost about \$28 million. Public meetings will be held at three locations. September 29 at the Clearbrook-Gonvick School, October 3 at the Gonvick Community Center and October 17 at the Leonard Township Building.

Principals report
Principal Josh Tharaldson gave his report. The school leadership team was to meet on August 24 to go over PLC plans and any final changes before the school year begins. Title & American Indian Education Aid applications was due September 1. They will be holding a meeting on August 30th during Open House. The American Indian Education Aid application is due November 30th and they will be meeting during Open House on August 30th.

They were to hold a zoom meeting on the training sessions for K-6 teachers and high school math teachers on the new curriculum.

August 31 will be kindergarten entrance conferences.

Corey Petterson on the negotiations committee said that everything was going good.

The Consent Calendar was approved. Total Non-Payroll paid for \$305,813.42 and payroll of \$169,722.28 for a total of \$475,535.70. Some payments include: NWCS/MEDICA \$43,473.82; Bemidji Bituminous Inc. \$23,700.00; Marco \$3,800.55; Listrom Disposal \$1,755.00; Garden Valley Telephone \$1,126.37 and Knutson Flynn & Deans \$1,110.00.

Donations received for the month included \$1,100 from the Abel family to the Music department. Three wheelchairs from Gustafson & Goudge that had been left in the Good Samaritan Center and 3 1/2 hours of labor to unload the playground mulch was appreciated.

No Old Business New Business

They accepted the resignations of Kasey Lene as the cook, who had been at the school for one year. The resignation of Melissa Larson as Assistant Girls Basketball coach. She was a new teacher last year and wants to be more involved as a volunteer. The resignation of Joe Skjaret as Information Technology Specialist. August 22 was his last day. He had been with the district for a little over 3 years.

They hired Deagan Griffin as the Custodian. He is a recent graduate of the school and will start on Step 1 for the district.

Three new coaches were hired. Paul Gustafson as Junior High Football Coach; Casey Crane also as a Junior High Football coach because of the large numbers in the program and Brittany Lefebvre as the Junior High Volleyball Coach.

The board raised the daily Teacher Substitute rate to \$150 per day.

They approved the contract with Clearwater County Nursing Services for a school nurse of a 3% increase of \$1,433.00 to \$32,788 for the school year.

They approved the Field Usage Agreement with the City of Clearbrook for use of Kloster Park for softball and baseball. Concession stand will still be run by the City.

They approved the 2023-2024 handbooks for the High School, Elementary School and Chromebooks.

The 2023-2024 bus routes were passed with a starting pickup time of 6:34 and ending time of 7:59 depending on the routes. The average miles

per day for the routes was 112 miles. They are seven routes with Steins Bus Service LLC. There will be some changes as families move in and out during the year.

The board hired Patty Mickelson as a band teacher for the 2023-2024 school years at Stwp 10. She has done several years of music at Goodridge. She will be starting the second quarter of the year with Mrs. Ragan taking over the band in the mean time. They have been working on similar visions for the band

BEMIDJI, Minn. – The Minnesota Department of Natural today the construction of the first phase of future extension of the Heartland State Trail between Park Rapids and the Itasca State Park. This project began on August 28 and is expected to be complete September 23, weather permitting. The tunnel project is under Highway 71 just south of Highway 200 near the Itasca State Park east entrance. Motorists traveling on Highway 71 will detour utilizing Hubbard County Roads 4 and 40.

The south entrance of Itasca State Park will remain open to motorists traveling on Highway 71 from the south. The east entrance of Itasca State Park will remain open to motorists trav-

eling west on Highway 71/200 from Lake George.
