Voting November 7

Clearbrook-Gonvick School board has set November 7, 2023 for the bond. Voters will be asked to approve the amount not to exceed \$28,370,000 for the school district.

All voting for every precinct will be done at the Clearbrook City Hall building at 200 Elm St SW, Clearbrook. Polls will be open from 10:00 am to 8:00 p.m. on election day Tuesday, November 7.

School patrons can request a mail ballot by calling the school and requesting that from Paula at 218-776-3112, ext. 108.

The \$28,370,000 investment will provide the following for our school, our communities, and our futures!

- Remodel main entrance to address safety and security.
- Addition of several single-

user toilets for students and staff.

- Addition of secure changing rooms for officials and coaching staff.

- Designated changing areas for visiting teams

- Expand cafeteria to move lunch tables out of the hallway corridor.

- Addition of a second cross corridor to reduce congestion during passing time.

- Roof Replacement.

- Replacement of damaged doors and hardware throughout building.

- Replacement of buckled flooring.

- Repairs and improvements to building systems.

- Improved and Expanded Learning Environments.

- Small group spaces for one-on-one learning.

- Right-sizing and modernizing the Media Center.

- Dedicated Special Education classrooms and consolidated SPED services.

- New SPED space allows FACS room to be used for intended purpose.

- Storage rooms and expansion of the staff workroom.

- Remodeling areas of the Elementary school to accommodate additional toilets and small group rooms.

- Acoustical upgrades to Commons and stage spaces.

- Replace small gym with two-station gym for Phy. Ed and capacity for Indoor Recess; creates more space for extracurricular and community events.

- Convert small gym to a larger fitness room, two additional Health/ Phy. Ed. classrooms and storage space.

Good Samaritan then and now

THEN

Back to the 1950's when Ingvald and Ida Aakre owned a portion of Clearbrook's south side, namely, Block one and two of Aakre's Third Addition to Clearbrook.

Apparently, the Aakre's were something of developers in the community. They had also owned, platted and sold lots in Aakre's First and Second Additions to Clearbrook.

We can assume they felt a since of loyalty towards the community and decided to contribute to their church as well as the city of Clearbrook. Therefore, on April 12, 1951 they donated the land upon which Good Samaritan Nursing facility would be located.

The original conveyance, in 1951, was made to The Lutheran Sunset Home, Clearbrook, Minnesota. Shortly thereafter, the Lutheran Sunset Home conveyed the entire property to the Evangelical Lutheran Good Samaritan Society. This transfer took place on June 5, 1951.

"Good Sam" ran successfully for over 60 years. It maintained several beds for its constituents, food service, full-time care and a separate residence (on the west side of the property) for staff.

Beginning in the mid 2000 teens the corporation began a consolidation of its facilities. The company held similar properties in Minnesota as well as North Dakota. Good Sam became a victim.

On January 10, 2018 Good Sam conveyed its interest in the facility to Eagle's Healing Nest, a nonprofit Minnesota corporation. This conveyance appeared to have been without consideration. That is to say no money changed hands at the time of sale.

Eagle's Nest retained title until the property forfeited to the State of Minnesota for failure to pay real estate taxes.

The building and accompanying grounds deteriorated over

time becoming somewhat of an eyesore in the community.

Along came Dylan Goudge and Paul Gustafson, principals of Gustafson & Goudge LLC.

They examined the facility and found due to a failure in the fire suppressor system the entire basement level had flooded and froze. When things thawed out the moisture created mold virtually throughout the building.

Dylan and Paul are in the construction business and have expertise and equipment that can raze structures of this type. After careful examination they determined they could demo the structure and begin again.

They approached the State of Minnesota, through the Com-

missioner of Revenue, who conveyed the nursing facility property and the nursing facility residence to Gustafson & Goudge Holdings, LLC on August 22, 2023. The purchase price \$170,000.00.

The current staff residence will remain intact. The nursing home will be torn down and removed. In its place Dylan and Paul plan senior living apartment complex consisting of eight separate accessible ground floor apartments with adjoining garage for each. The first two units should be available for occupancy in September, 2024. The remaining units to follow thereafter.

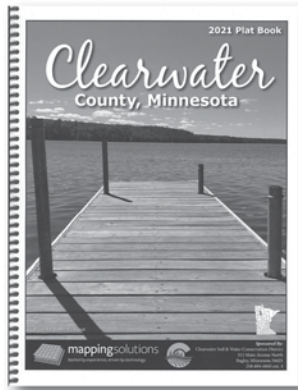

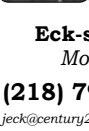

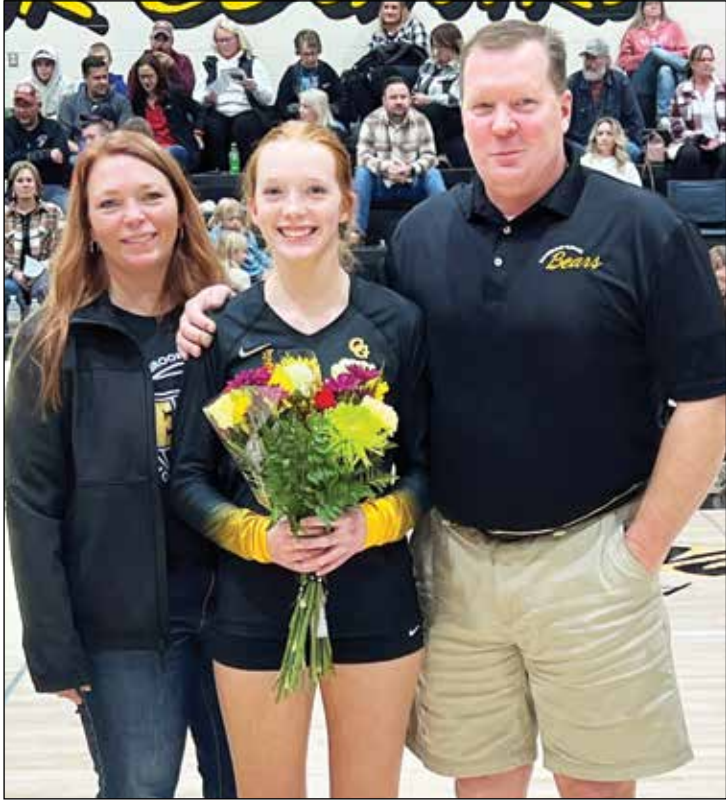
