Veterans Day program will be held at the Clearbrook-Gonvick School on Friday, November 10, at 10:00 am.

Lieutenant Colonel Jeff Melander will be the special speaker for the day. Lieutenant Colonel Melander, doctor of veterinary medicine, was born in Bagley, graduated from Fosston High School in 1971, attended the University of Minnesota, Morris, and graduated

from University of Minnesota, St. Paul with a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree in 1979. He was commissioned into the United States (U.S.) Army Veterinary Corps in November 1986. He attended graduate school at Colorado State University and completed a Master of Science degree in environmental health in 1994. In 2002, he graduated from the U.S. Army War College.

Project started to include locating all of the wells in the county

The Board of Commissioners met on October 31, with all members present. The agenda for the meeting and the minutes from the last meeting were both reviewed and approved.

Kaleb Buesing from Clearwater County Soil and Water Conservation district explained that the UofM and DNR were in the process of creating a geologic atlas of the state and were asking for approval of the board to include Clearwater County. The project would include locating all of the wells in the county. Based on history, the board members have a high level of distrust of the DNR. After some discussion, Commissioner John Nelson made a motion to approve the project, seconded by Commissioner Mark Larson. The motion passed with Commissioner Mark Titera casting the lone no vote.

County Attorney Kathryn Lorschach was next to address the board. She asked the board to approve a software license for the new Asst. County Attorney in the amount of \$2,925.00 per year. Before making a motion, the board waived the 3-day notice for this request. Then Commissioner Titera made a motion to approve the purchase, seconded by Commissioner Stuart Dukek, motion passed.

Sheriff Darin Halverson submitted a request to hire

Noah Sheldon as a full-time Deputy Sheriff effective October 31 at Range 17, step 1. This position would fill the vacancy created by the retirement of Larry Olson. A motion to approve the request was made by Commissioner Larson, seconded by Commissioner Nelson, motion passed.

Board Coordinator Amy Jordan presented the 2022 financial statement on behalf of Auditor-Treasurer Allen Paulson. Commissioner Dean Newland made the motion to approve the 2022 financial statement for publication, seconded by Commissioner Larson, motion carried.

County Engineer Dan Sauvé had several items to discuss regarding the Highway Department. The first item was regarding maintenance agreements with townships and other government agencies. Commissioner Titera made a motion to authorize the board chair to sign the maintenance agreements for the period of 2023-2027 for those townships and agencies that wanted to implement the agreements. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Dukek and the motion carried. Suave then presented a resolution to apply for Local Road Improvement Program (LRIP) funds for CSAH 23 (Leonard to Hwy 2). Commissioner Dukek made a motion to approve the resolu-

tion, seconded by Commissioner Larson. Motion carried. Sauvé then presented a certificate of performance for CP 23-0300 and requested authorization for final payment to Northern Aggregate Inc. Motion and seconded by Commissioners Larson & Dukek, motion carried. Next was a certificate of performance for SAP 015-609-007, a bridge replacement on CSAH 9. Commissioner Nelson made a motion to accept the certificate and authorize final payment to Gladen Construction Inc. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Larson and the motion carried. The final item presented by Sauvé was the request to purchase a used crash attenuator trailer from MNDOT for \$1,000.00. Commissioner Dukek made the motion to approve the purchase, seconded by Commissioner Titera. During discussion, Sauvé was asked how much the trailer would cost new and he replied that they are around \$30,000. The motion carried to purchase the used trailer.

With no further items on the agenda, the meeting was adjourned.

IMPORTANT PROPERTY TAX HOMESTEAD NOTICE

This will affect your 2024 property taxes and eligibility for Property Tax Refund.

Have you purchased or moved into a property in the past year?

Contact your county assessor to file a homestead application if you or a qualifying relative occupy the property as a homestead on or before December 31, 2023.

What is a qualifying relative?

For unoccupied agricultural property, a qualifying relative includes the child, grandchild, sibling, or parent of the owner or owner's spouse.

For occupied agricultural or residential property, a qualifying relative also includes the owner's uncle, aunt, nephew, or niece.

When do I apply?

You must apply on or before December 31, 2023.

Once homestead is granted, annual applications are not necessary unless they are requested by the county assessor.

Contact the assessor by December 31, 2023 if the use of the property you own or occupy as a qualifying relative has changed during the past year.

If you sell, move, or for any reason no longer qualify for the homestead classification, you are required to notify the county assessor within 30 days of the change in homestead status.

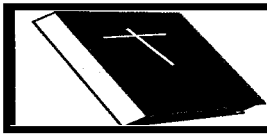

Fargo, ND — The Fertile-Beltrami Falcons won their third consecutive Section 6 9-Man Football Championship on Thursday night versus the Clearbrook-Gonvick Bears with a 52-20 win.

The win was not easy for the Falcons as they were punched

by Clearbrook-Gonvick early in the game as the Bears for the Falcons into an early three and out and Clearbrook-Gonvick would drive right down the field to take the first lead of the game. The Fertile-Beltrami high powered offense would be able to answer and take an 8-6 lead into the early parts of the second quarter when the night was brought to a halt after Junior Running Back Jonah Harstad caught a 69 pass and was tackled inside the Clearbrook-Gonvick 10 yard line. On the tackle, Harstad would suffer a serious leg injury that stopped the game for almost a half an hour. After the unfortunate injury to Harstad, Fertile-Beltrami would play the rest of the game with a lot of emotion and adrenaline as they poured it on taking a large lead into half time and eventually winning 52-20.

Fertile-Beltrami will now play the Section 8 9-Man Football Champion Goodridge/Gryla Chargers next Thursday

night at Moorehead High School in the State 9-Man Quarter-finals.

The weather is getting cooler and people are beginning to escape the Northern Minnesota winter, a common question we hear is, "What if I need to use VA healthcare while traveling?" Your answer depends on a few factors. How long you'll be gone, what kind of services you'll need, and where you are traveling to – just to name a few.

If you are currently enrolled in VA Healthcare and planning a longer vacation away from your primary VA location, you'll want to make contact with your VA Care Team and let them know in advance. They will be able to help you facilitate care at a VA location near where you'll be staying. (4-6 week notice if possible.) The care team will be asking for (1) your travel destination and temporary address, (2) A telephone number where they can reach you while you're away, (3) Your arrival and departure dates, (4) Any specific care concerns. The VA will also mail prescription refills to a temporary address.

While on shorter vacations and if you need to see a doctor for things such as a sore throat or an earache, you will need to go to a VA medical facility, or an in-network care facility. The VA will ONLY pay for urgent care if the provider is part of the VA contracted network, so you will want to inform the urgent care provider that you will be using your VA urgent care benefit to receive care. A separately billed co-pay by the VA may be applicable after the visit. They will confirm your eligibility. Always ask and verify.



To find an in-network urgent care provider, contact your local VA medical facility, use the VA Facility Locator at <http://va.gov/find-locations/> or call the Community Care Contact Center: 877-881-7618. This is important because Veterans may be required to pay the full cost of care if they go to an out-of-network urgent care provider.

If you find yourself far from a VA medical center, they may pay for emergency care in a non-VA setting. Be sure to contact your nearest VA medical center as soon as possible—and ask to talk to the patient transfer or patient administration representative.

This all seems complicated but a long story short, VA healthcare is the country's largest integrated health care system serving nearly 9 million Veterans a year. There are more than 1,200 care locations and your health care team will help assist you in getting the care you need, no matter where you are.

As a reminder, the Veteran's Service Office has Emergency Care Cards to help veterans (or their loved ones) notify the VA within 72 hours of an emergency visit. If you would like to get one, please give us a call at 218-694-6181, or stop by and we will write one up with your specific information.

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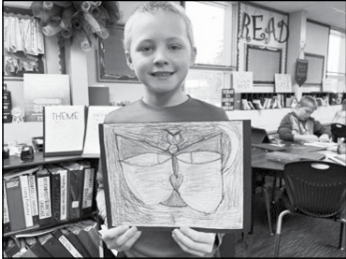

Memories were made as we spent a total of three hours together over the course of three days. Creating precious

memories that will stay with me forever. It is my hope their memories too, will be equally precious. Staying with them in memory long after they grow into adulthood. Nothing is perhaps so memorably bonding as joining together in story sharing and art making. The kind that helps us learn, in an entertaining way, aspects of ourselves as humans. Humans who are full of wise stories and good, creative potential.

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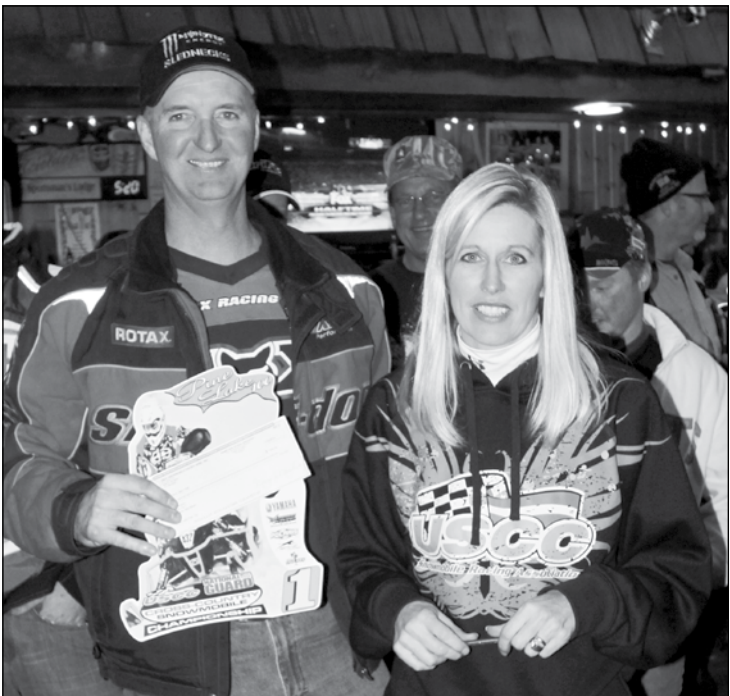
