Short meeting for Clearbrook City Council on January 8

The regular meeting of December 11 and Truth in Taxation meetings were approved.

Police Report by Ryan Sollee, Police Chief was presented. A questions was asked on cars that need to be moved for snow removal. The city ordinance states that if there is a cost for moving the vehicle it will be charged to the person who owns the car, truck or boat.

Solee also presented the incidents for the month. Thoughts from the Sheriff

Clearwater County Sheriff Darin Halverson



I hope you all had a wonderful holiday season and are off to a great new year. It is that time of year where I like to give a recap of activity in our county and what we have been working on to improve law enforcement for our community. I hope this information helps you better understand what is happening and make you more aware.

There was a total of 7,104 calls for service countywide in 2023. That number is almost equal to 2022 when there were 7,123 calls. Deputies in Clearwater County responded to 3,876 of those calls for service last year. A breakdown of some of the calls responded to by deputies show 89 theft calls, 21 burglaries, 34 assaults, 40 domestic assaults and 115 crimes against family calls. The crimes against family calls include child protection and vulnerable adult cases. I am happy to report that burglary calls continue to decline in the county.

Other law enforcement agencies working in our county include the Bagley, Clearbrook/Gonvick and White Earth Police Departments as well as the Minnesota State Patrol. I do not have access to the State Patrol numbers so they will not be reflected here. A breakdown of calls responded to by the other agencies within their respective jurisdictions are as follows: Bagley - 1,275 calls, Clearbrook/Gonvick - 197 calls and White Earth - 218 calls. In addition to law enforcement activity, there were also 66 fire calls as well as 672 medical calls.

As you can see, our first responders were kept busy last year serving our county. A look at where the most activity took place show that the City of Bagley was busiest with 2,716 calls followed by 516 in Copley Township, 437 in the City of Clearbrook, 422 in North LaPrairie Township, 293 in the City of Shevlin and 252 in Leon Township.

We continue to work with the courts, probation and the county attorney's office with the newly implemented DWI court. The DWI court is a program designed for repeat DWI offenders who are striving to turn their life around and become sober. If accepted in the program, the participant must make regular appearances in court and are monitored closely by probation and our deputy assigned to the DWI court. There are four phases that the participant must complete and it typically takes

at least 18 months to complete. The hope is that the participant will change their life and become alcohol or drug free and experience a more satisfying life. There are currently six individuals in the DWI court program and it has been a very positive and valuable endeavor.

Another exciting addition to our office this past year has been the addition of our K9 unit. It had been many years since Clearwater County had a K9 working the streets, but with the generous donations of businesses/organizations and citizens of our county, we were able to start the program again. It has proven valuable as K9 Akim and Deputy Moses have conducted numerous vehicle searches for illegal narcotics as well as tracking suspects that have fled and building searches.

In addition to our K9 unit, we also sent a deputy to training that certified him to be a drug recognition expert (DRE). This is beneficial to identify whether individuals are operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of drugs. We are grateful to have a deputy trained in this specialty.

At the end of 2023, we were awarded a grant through the Office of Traffic Safety for a Highway Traffic Safety Officer. We are excited for this opportunity and are in the process of advertising for a new deputy. This grant will allow us to provide one deputy that will be dedicated for traffic safety focusing on speed, distracted driving, seat belt usage and DWI.

I hope this 2023 snapshot of what occurred in our county is beneficial to the public by providing a better understanding of activity responded to by our first responders and which areas of the county saw the most activity. We continue to work diligently to provide the best service to the residents of Clearwater County and those who visit here. I, again, want to thank the public for your support and kindness shown to us throughout the year. We stand ready to serve the citizens of Clearwater County.

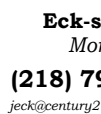


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
