The farm has been in the family with Craig Strandlien, the 4th generation to own the farm.

Anton and Tilla (Hagen) Strandlien was the first generation on the farm in 1912. Their children were Martha, Helmer, Theodor, Lilly and Clarence. Helmer and his wife Allyne Strandlien bought the farm in 1939. They had five children Norris, Joyce, Alice, Phyllis, Harland and Constance. Norris and Lila, Strandlien, parents of Craig had the farm after that.

The Clearwater Polk Electric was present to give people a bird's eye look of the Strandlien Farm. They were lifted up on the large equipment.

It takes a lot of people to put on a free Breakfast on the Farm. Heading the group was the Headwaters Farm Bureau, The Clearwater County Fair board, The Whoa and Go Harness Club. The Bagley and Gonvick Lions Club helped prepare and

Bemidj Veterans home officially dedicated

Over 400 people attended the official dedication of the new Bemidji veterans home. It is the third home to be open with ones in Montevideo and Preston that were opened earlier this year. The Bemidji home has 24 residents with space for up to 72.

Introductions for the many in attendance was given by Kevin Gish, Administrator of the Bemidji home with the welcome by Bemidji Mayor Jorge Prince.

Drum songs by Aazhoomon Singers and the Pledge of Allegiance by Shane Gustafson, Beltrami County Veterans Service Officer.

There were honor guards from several area towns in-

cluding Walker, Bagley, White Earth, Bemidji and Clearbrook along with Freedom Riders.

There were many speakers and "We are grateful so many elements came together to make this a reality," said Brad Lindsay, Commissioner, Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs (MDVA). "We wouldn't be here today at this new veterans home without the hard work and support of the Bemidji community, the funding from the State as well as the Federal Veterans Administration, and collaboration with many institutions, organizations and businesses."

"Our residents and their

families deserve the very best," says Bemidji Veterans Home Administrator Kevin Gish. "This dedication marks an important day for Bemidji and Northern Minnesota. It's helping fulfill our mission to serve veterans and their families with the benefits they've earned."

To be accepted for admission, residents must be:

- Discharged under honorable conditions from any branch of the U.S. armed forces and a current resident of Minnesota, who served 181 consecutive days on active duty, unless discharged earlier because of disability incurred in the line

of duty

- The spouse of an eligible veteran who is at least 55 years old and meets residency requirements.

- Able to demonstrate a medical or clinical need for skilled nursing care.

The project history was given by Scotty Allison, Veterans Home Committee and former Beltrami County Veterans Service Officer.

There was also talks about a Veterans cemetery to be started.

The prayer of dedication was given by Philip House, Chaplain.

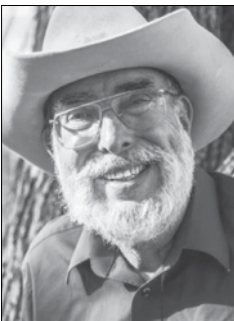

Get Your Kids in for well-child visits and sports physicals

Don't wait until you're overwhelmed with school preparation to get your kids in for well-child visits and sports physicals at RiverView Health. Now is the perfect time to check those items off your to-do list before the rush of supply shopping and sports practices begins.

"Annual well-child exams are not only a time to update immunizations, but also a time to make sure your child is healthy and growing as they should," shared Riley Hermreck, FNP-C.

As a family nurse practitioner, Hermreck sees patients from birth through age 18 for well-child exams. Other family medicine providers available for well-child visits are Dr. Lauren Rose, Dr. Erik Kantan, Natalie Royal, FNP-C, Tia Gullickson, FNP-C, Forrest LaPort, CNP, and Paul Reese, PA.

Yearly well-child exams are essential to your child's good health, allowing their provider time to check your child's physical and mental health and overall well-being.

- Well-child exams allow for
- Observation of growth and development
 - Detection of illness by screening examinations
 - Immunization maintenance
 - Counseling and education of parents and children
 - Promotion of mental health

Time to address concerns, get additional help

Well-child visits are a great time to discuss any concerns about your child with their provider. If they are not doing well academically or socially, or if there are problems in the family, this is an excellent time to reach out for help. Your provider can help you access many resources, such as other medical professionals, counselors (child and/or family), and local programs.

To get the most out of your child's visit:

- Prepare a list of things you would like to discuss with the provider and bring that list with you to the visit.
- Do not be afraid to discuss a subject that concerns you.
- Talk to others around you who spend time with your child – teachers, grandparents, parents of peers, etc. They can help you identify any issues you might not have noticed.
- Check with your insurance company; most insurance policies cover the cost of well-child exams.

Sports physicals offered at same

appointment

If your child is entering seventh grade or above and plans to participate in sports, they can get a well-child exam and sports physical at the same appointment. If this is your intention, let the patient access representative know when you call to schedule the appointment.

The Minnesota State High School League (MSHSL) requires students to have a physical exam every three years, typically before entering seventh and tenth grades. The sports physical is an opportunity to address exercise-specific issues, including injuries, nutrition, training and exercise programs, and even attitudes toward sports participation.

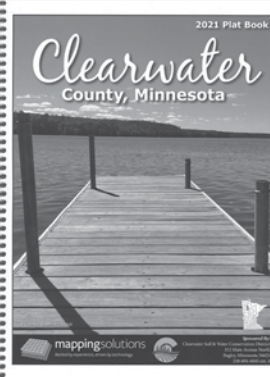
While a RiverView sports physical meets all of the requirements for participation in sports by the MSHSL, a sports physical is not intended to replace a well-child exam. A well-child exam is much more comprehensive and includes reviewing immunization records, medical history, and family history.

To speed up your child's in-person appointment, fill out the MSHSL's sports physical form and bring it to the appointment.

Signs your dog may be dehydrated

Water is essential for mammals' bodies to operate at peak capacity. The American Kennel Club says water is necessary to lubricate joints, facilitate digestion, regulate body temperature, and cushion internal organs, among many other functions. Similar to humans, pets that fail to consume enough water can face dire consequences. Dehydration is a medical term for when the body has lost more fluid than it has taken in. Dehydration can occur at any time, but it is even more common during the warm weather months. Dogs quickly can become very sick from dehydration. That is why every pet owner should learn how to recognize the symptoms of

dehydration in their dogs. The Veterinary Emergency Group says symptoms of mild dehydration can include:

- **Dry nose**, although this also can be a signal of other problems, like fever.
- **Excessive drooling** occurs as the dog tries to cool down its body.
- **A dehydrated dog** can exhibit signs of fatigue, including a reluctance to move around much.
- **Sticky gums** As the dog becomes more dehydrated, the following symptoms can develop:
- **Loss of elasticity** of the skin.
- **Loss of appetite.**
- **Thickening** of the dog's

saliva.

- **Gums may go** from sticky to dry.
- **Excessive panting** may begin.
- **Vomiting or diarrhea** also may occur.
- **Dehydration causes** the body to redistribute fluid lost, and fluid may be pulled from the eyes, causing the eyes to appear sunken.

If a dog appears to be dehydrated, you can start offering small amounts of water to slowly rehydrate the animal, says Northeast Veterinary Referral Hospital. It's important to call the veterinarian and get further advice regarding how to address dehydration. Some vets may suggest offering an electrolyte-enhanced fluid like Pedialyte so electrolyte loss does not affect organs. The vet may want you to come into the office so the dog can receive intravenous fluids, says the American Kennel Club. The best way to treat dehydration is to prevent it in the first place. Provide dogs with a constant supply of clean, clear water at all times. The amount of water needs to increase if the dog is spending time outdoors in hot weather or exercising. Cats also are prone to dehydration and can exhibit the same symptoms as dogs. So cat owners also must be diligent in checking for dehydration symptoms in their pets.

Grants available to improve safety on MN farms

MDA program reimburses up to \$2,400 per year per farm.

Minnesota farmers looking to add safety equipment to their on-farm grain storage facilities can now apply for the Minnesota Department of Agriculture's (MDA) Grain Storage Facility Safety Grant program. The program reimburses up to 75% of the cost to purchase and install eligible safety equipment for on-farm grain bins or silos. Applicants are eligible to receive up to \$400 per bin or silo, with a limit of \$2,400 per farm per year. Grant funding comes from a legislative appropriation of \$75,000 for both the Grain Storage Facility Safety Grant and the Rollover Protective Structure (ROPS) Rebate programs. "Handling grain comes with a high level of risk, and workers



should take every precaution possible to prevent potential tragedies," said MDA Commissioner Thom Petersen. "I encourage farmers to make use of this grant opportunity to help themselves, their families, and their employees stay safe around their silos and bins." Examples of eligible safety equipment include, but are not limited to:

- Fall protection systems,

- Engineering controls that prevent contact with an auger or other moving parts,
 - Dust collection systems that minimize explosion hazards,
 - Personal protective equipment that increases the likelihood of surviving a grain-bin-related emergency,
 - Grain silo air quality monitoring equipment, and
 - Other grain storage facility safety equipment with prior approval from the MDA.
- The MDA is accepting grant applications through May 15, 2025, or until all funds are exhausted. Funds will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis. For more information and to apply, visit the MDA's Grain Storage Facility Safety Grant webpage.

The CDC notes that heatstroke is a medical emergency, so individuals who suspect they or someone in their presence is experiencing heatstroke should call 911 immediately. If heat exhaustion is suspected, seek immediate medical help if a person is vomiting, experiencing symptoms that are worsening or sticking around for one hour or longer.

Brockhouse has published his first book

Northwest Minnesota Resident Publishes His First Book: For Kids' Sake, Be Great! How Caregivers Create Positive Environments in Separate Homes
Middle River, Minnesota resident Howard Brockhouse has published his first book; For Kids' Sake, Be Great! How Caregivers Create Positive Environments in Separate Homes.

The book focuses on four simple principles that Howard and his ex-wife did when raising their kids in separate homes. "The most important thing we can do as caregivers is focus on our kids' well-being and that is even more challenging if you're raising kids in separate homes," Howard said. "Another critical component of caregiving in separate homes is the mental health of the caregiver," Howard said. The book provides pathways for the caregiver so they can be healthy and at their best for the benefit of themselves and their children. "There are a lot of books on co-parenting but very few focus on the mental health of the caregiver and coming out of separation or divorce, we often have a tremendous amount of hurt that needs to be addressed," Howard said.

The book came about from a parent-teacher conference many years ago where the teacher was new to the district, and she could not tell that Howard's daughter was from separate homes. "I told the teacher I needed my daughter's paperwork mailed to my house, we need copies at my house and

her mom's house. The teacher said, 'What, I would've never known your divorced by watching your daughter in class.' Howard started asking himself what he and his ex-wife were doing and that resulted in a trained educator not knowing his daughter was from a separate home.

The book is all first-hand accounts of the things that Howard and his ex-wife did that resulted in their children being healthy and happy. It also describes the things that Howard and his ex-wife did to repair and maintain their mental health coming out of the trauma of separation.
