2 Loons Letters and Threads has a new location in Gonvick. Jay Jones has moved from the Clear Waters Life Center and is now on Main Street. He had been at the old school since he and "Gus" Vetteson started the business in February of 2015.

Since that point Gus went on to a job at Bemidji State University and Jay continued with the business. He provides screen printing, embroidery, heat transfer, vinyl sign work and design services. That has been done for many events, schools, business places and church groups in a large area.

Jays fabric and inks is purchased from different vendors. He uses Plastisol ink which is not water based. The dryer is set at different degrees depending on the material. That is to ensure that the design will stick on the fabric. Doing the orange shirts for the logo he had the temperature set at 330 degrees which was nice as it was cooler outside. Gonvick City council meeting

The Gonvick City Council met in regular session on Wednesday, October 10. They opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Open Forum for visitors had two with Clearwater Coating requesting a commercial revolving loan from the loan fund that is available through the city. They requested \$5,000 to build a metal wall in his shop near the coating oven.

The second person was Evon Quern with the Gonvick Jubilee Committee. There has been discussion on changing Santa Claus Day in Gonvick to a Friday night December 6 instead of Saturday. Jon Watne has donated a tree to be displayed on Main Street that would be similar to what had been done years ago. A lighting the tree and other activities are being pursued. The committee will be meeting again to make more plans.

Ryan Solee police report for the month included 15 records. They were Animal Related 1; Animal Related Trespass 1; Assist Other Agency 1; Civil Complaint 1; Medical 4; Suspicious activity 1; Trespass 3; Trespass Disturbance 1; Vehicle Lock Out 2.

Cody Rude gave the Fire Department report. For the month there were four medical calls, two work nights, one fund raiser, the control burn in Clearbrook was canceled because of the weather. They have received a water tanker from the DNR with no charge to the department. Brandon Oien has been added as a new member to the fire department. they received a 50/50 grant and will be hearing more in the future. Their food stand fund raiser sold out on Pumpkin Day.

A request for a culvert to be put in for a resident was not a city responsibility.

The contractor for water main breaks was discussed with two being suggested and they would have to be contacted for more details.

The tree trimming at the community center was approved to have Caleb Stromquist trim down the three trees for \$600. Putting Christmas lights up by the city maintenance crew and the purchase of new lights to be added to the old string.

Resolution 23-02 for the Taxable General Obligation

Sanitary Sewer Revenue Bond for \$25,000 was approved.

Bills were paid for water and sewer at \$6,140.20; General \$37,136.85, Fire \$820.59 for a total of \$44,097.64.

Expenditures for Pumpkin and Car Show Day

The expenditures for the Gonvick Pumpkin and Car Show day were presented at the Gonvick City Council. Donations from the Gonvick Lions Club \$5,000; Gonvick Diamond Jubilee \$5,000; Clearbrook Community Club \$500 for youth and Rosemary Smith \$100 for youth.

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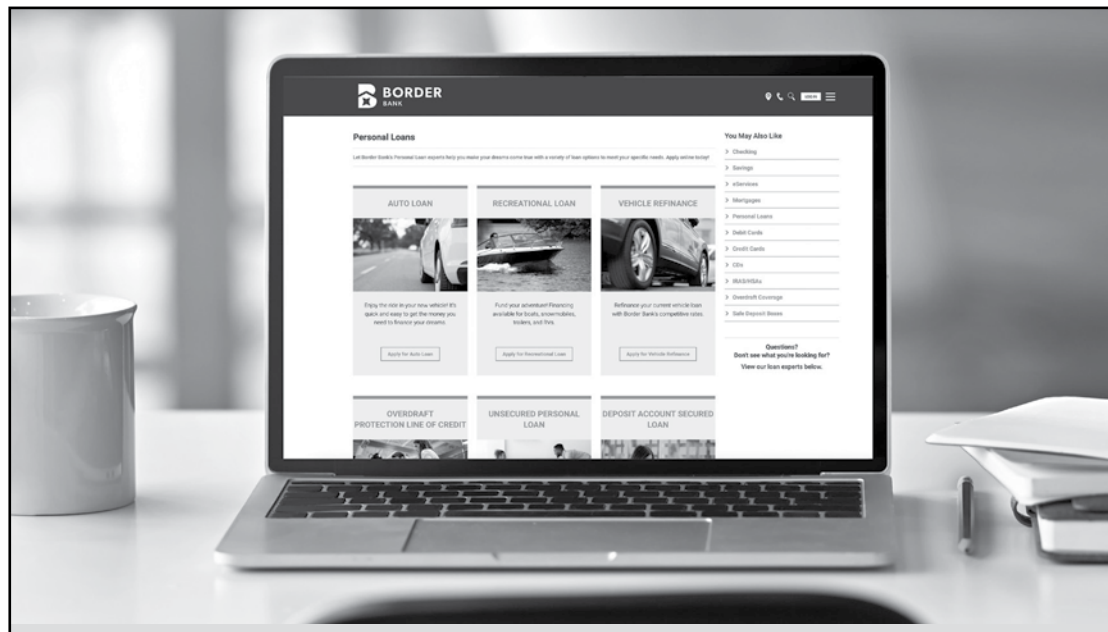

Win-E-Mac hosted the Clearbrook-Gonvick Bears for their Homecoming. The first quarter both teams were having trouble getting the ball down field.

Win-E-Mac opened the second quarter with a touchdown. They tried a trick play for the 2 point conversion to make the score 8-0.

It was tight defense the rest of the second quarter but at the end of the quarter the Patriots were able to get the ball into the end zone to make the score 14-0 going into half time. The extra point was no good.

The Bears lost their quarterback Carver Kroulik and Hasani Bruton took over the position. Braxton Bjerke took a pass from Bruton and went in for the TD to make the score 14-6. The extra point was not good. There was a series of fumbles on both side with Cooper Wishard recovering one of them. They were not able to capitalize on the turnover but the Patriots had a TD with the extra point conversion putting the score at 22-6. The Bears had a 90 yard TD run by Avery Ostenaas with the extra two point conversion good to make the score 22-14.
