ATV Safety

The Clearwater County Sheriff's Office is hosting an ATV Safety Class for interested operators ages 10 and older who wish to obtain their ATV Safety Certificate. An ATV Safety Certificate is required in the State of MN for anyone born after July 1, 1987. Students who are 16 or older can take the online course only and do not need to attend a field day. Visit www.dnr.state.mn.us for more information.

There are three steps:

Step 1: Contact Andy Anderson at 218-776-3112 Ext #104 or andyanderson@clearbrook-gonvick.k12.mn.us to pre-register.

Step 2: Visit www.dnr.state.mn.us and click on "Education and Safety" > "Recreational Vehicle Safety Classes" and follow the links to take the online ATV Safety Course. After the online course is complete, print the certificate/voucher and bring it to the Field Day.

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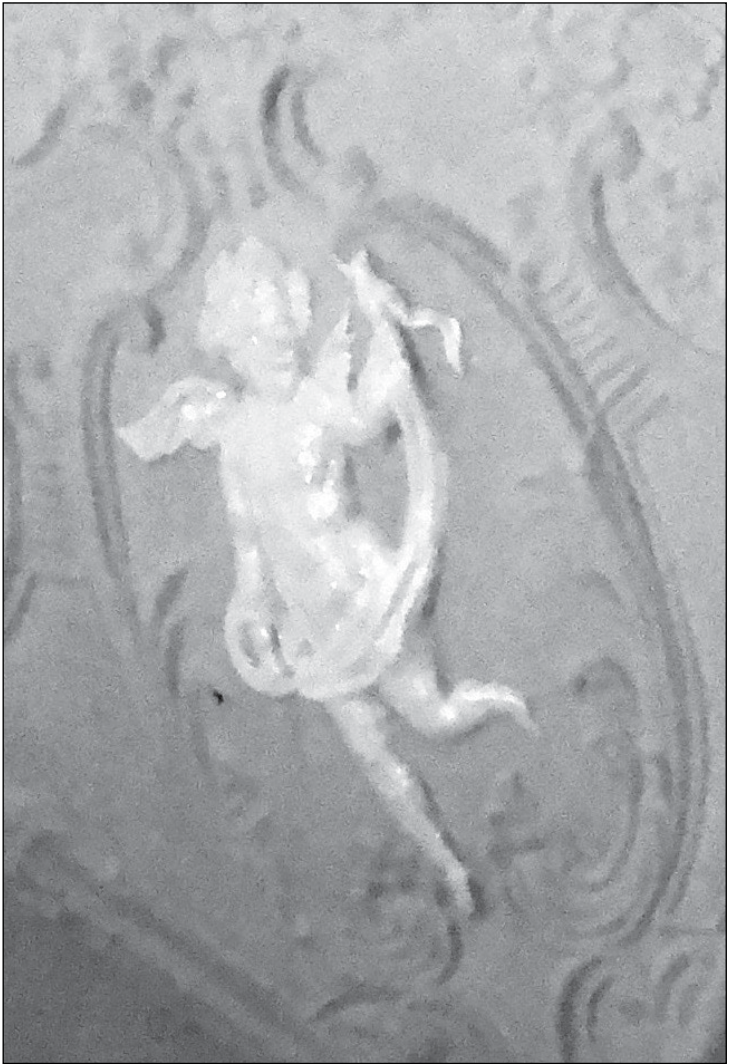


Tell Me Your Angel Story, and I Will Tell You Mine

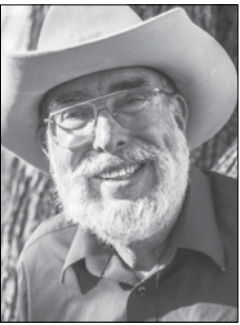
Ah ... politics! If you're a responsible American, as I often pretend to be, you'll have watched and read and listened to as much hogwash on every side of every question ad nauseum, and we'll all troop to the polls, read the names and say "Is this the best you guys can do for candidates?"

And then we'll vote, anyway. And that's why I'd like to suggest March 4 as a new national holiday, it being the entire term of the only non-toxic President of the United States.

His name was David Rice Atchison, who later on had Atchison, Kansas named for him, along with one third of the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railroad.

Never heard of him? Well, he was a pro-slavery Democrat who never met a bottle of booze he didn't like. But back in 1849, when Atchison became President for an entire day, some people knew how to throw parties. And Atchison spent his entire term as President sleeping off a dandy drunk. (You can always turn here for the real skinny on history, of course).

Here's what happened. At noon on March 4, 1849, the term of President James Polk ended. At that very moment, the term of incoming President John Taylor was scheduled

This left a 24-hour period where the United States didn't have a President. Normally, the vice president would take over, but his term expired at Sunday noon, just like Polk's.

So we look on the list of successors and who do we find? David Rice Atchison of Missouri, who was president pro-tem of the Senate.

His headstone says "President of the United States for one day" too.

But we should set March 4 aside in honor of this man, because he was the only leader of this nation who didn't get at least half the country mad at him. For the rest of his life, Atchison enjoyed polishing this historical hiccup, describing his presidency as "the honestest administration this country ever had."

May his example shine forever.

1/2 cup milk



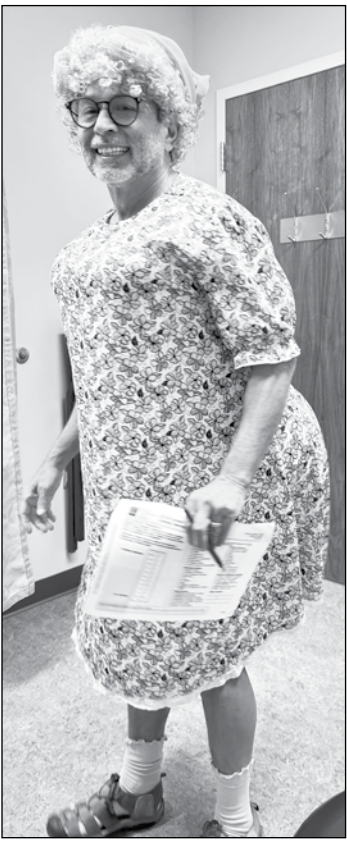

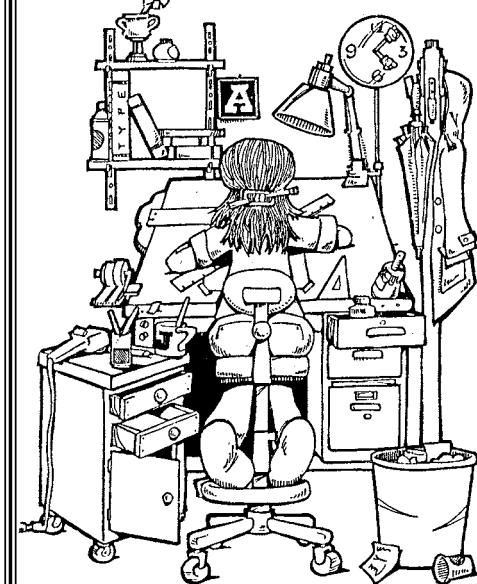

Local MnDOT crew member helps with hurricane cleanup

Jeremiah Vad, of Grygla, was among the MnDOT team members who just got back from South Carolina where crews helped with hurricane relief. MnDOT responded to a call for assistance to help clear debris from Hurricane Helene. Vad, who is Minnesota Department of Transportation employee, based out of Grygla, left with a team on October 14th. They drove the two days straight and worked near Greenville, South Carolina. He just arrived back on Saturday, October 26th. MnDOT was looking for volunteers after South Carolina had reached out to all 50 states to help with the hurricane clean-up. Seniority was given within the districts, which allowed Vad the chance to go and offer his help. Eight employees from District 4 and two from District 2 left from the District office in Detroit Lakes on Monday, Oct. 14th. “We so appreciate our coworkers who eagerly responded to help others who are dealing with such a catastrophic

event,” said Commissioner Nancy Daubenberger. “We are proud to work with such dedicated public servants and good people.” Vad said his crew spent their time clearing trees from the road. “We were on the southern edge of the worst of it, so we didn’t see the real bad stuff,” he said. However, he mentioned the trees were 2-3 feet around and 50-80 feet tall. The MnDOT crew brought a skid steer, forestry trucks, trailers, utility terrain vehicles, a timber chopper and miscellaneous equipment including chain saws, personal protective gear and communications equipment. This response was made possible through the Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC), a national interstate mutual aid agreement that enables states to share resources during times of disaster. Remembering Veterans

On Monday, November 11, 2024, the United States will celebrate Veteran's Day. The Veterans that died in service to their country during wartime are honored on the Memorial's black marble monuments. The Veterans that have served and are serving the United States are honored with the etched field stones that have been placed at the Memorial. Presently, approximately 1100 Veterans are honored with the etched field stones. On Saturday, August 31, 2024, the 11th annual "RIDE FOR STONES" took place which raises money to honor the Veterans of Clearwater County. This motorcycle ride was originated by, and continues to be promoted by, both Jeff Schermerhorn, Bagley, MN; a Vietnam Era Veteran, and Neal Illies, a Bagley resident. The 2024 ride raised approximately \$20,000 in donations. These donations were donated to the Clearwater County Veterans Memorial to provide 100 new etched field stones honoring Clearwater County Veterans. 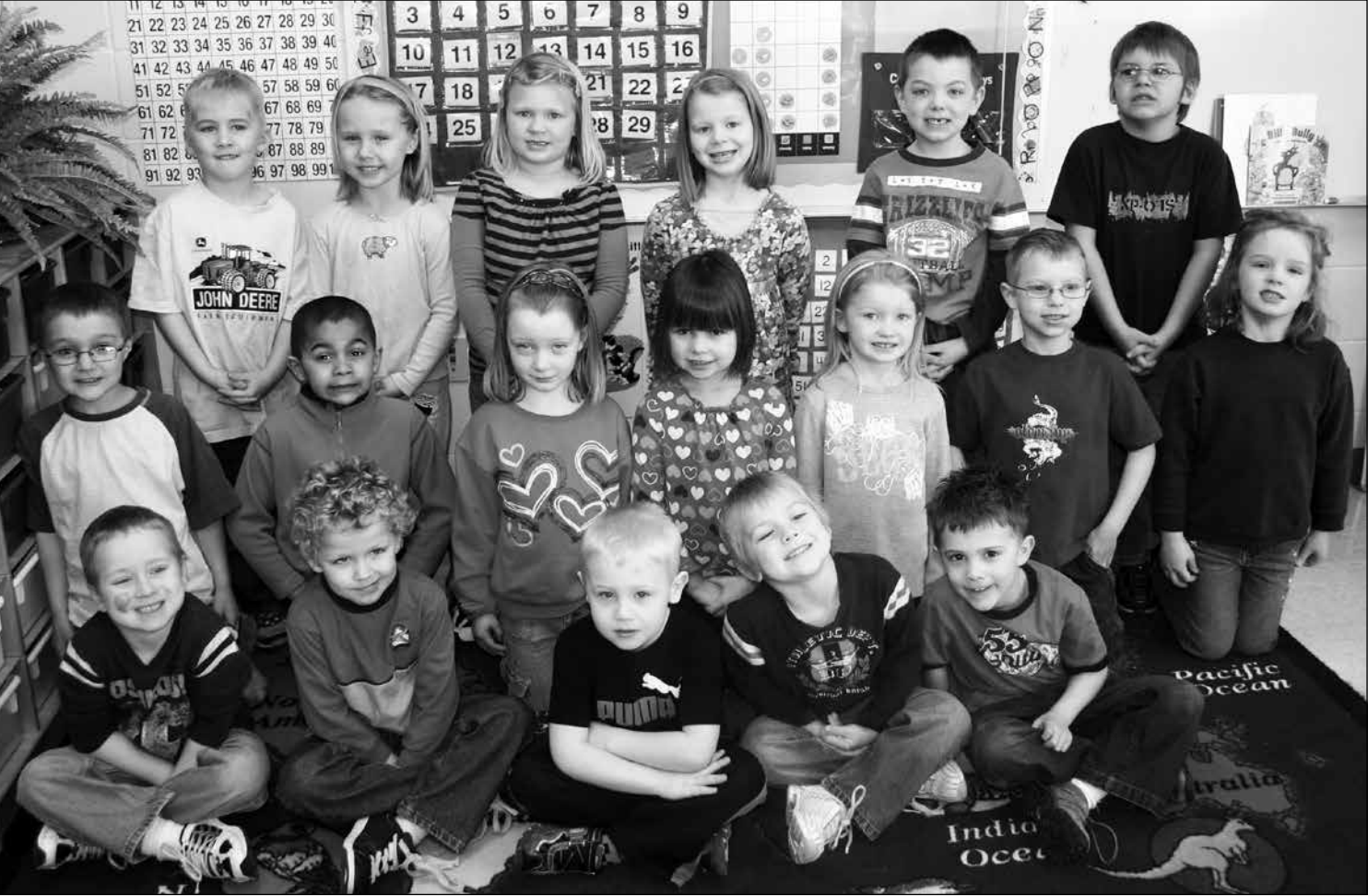
