Artists Engage Community Grant applications are due April 15th

The Artists Engage Community Grant is open to artists or culture bearers in all arts disciplines, 21 years of age or older, living and working in one of the five Region 2 Arts Council counties of Beltrami, Clearwater, Hubbard, Lake of the Woods, or Mahanomen, Minnesota, that are interested in sharing their art and/or cultural practices with their community in meaningful ways.

Artists Engage Community grants support the creation, production, and presentation of high-quality arts activities, such as classes, camps, presentations, or workshops in visual, craft, music, literary, film, dance, theatrical, or cultural arts, public art or participatory arts activities, or community music, theater or dance performances, that help instill the arts into the community and public life in our region. Eligible grant proposals must connect and engage with audiences, participants, students, and/or communities to provide new and/or expanded arts or

cultural arts programming to residents of our region's counties, and remove barriers that audiences may have to accessing arts or cultural activities. Activities proposed for funding must be artist-performer/culture bearer-led, accessible by the public, and connect with community members through the arts.

Maximum Award: \$6,000

County Board of Commissioners Report

The Clearwater County Board of Commissioners met on Tuesday, March 11 with all commissioners in attendance.

Commissioner Stuart Dukek, the board chairman opened the meeting at 9 am. Following the review and approval of the agenda and minutes from the last meeting, department heads were next on the agenda.

Lisa Syverson, Public Health Administrator, requested permission to hire Evelyn Wolden-Bookey as a licensed practical nurse serving as the school health paraprofessional. Commissioner Mark Larson made the motion to approve the hiring, seconded by Commissioner Bruce Emmel. Motion carried.

Karin Hughes, County Attorney, requested permission to hire Seth Keyser as assistant county attorney effective April 7, 2025, at Range 24, step 10. Commissioner Mark Larson made the motion to approve the hiring, seconded by Commissioner Bruce Emmel. Motion carried.

Bruce Cox, Land Commissioner, requested approval for the seasonal wage scale for maintenance/grounds/office attendants being Range 8, steps 1-10 and security personnel being Range 17, steps 1-10. A motion was made by Commissioner Bryan Ramsrud to approve the wage scale, seconded by Commissioner Dukek. Motion carried.

Darin Halverson, County Sheriff, requested permission to purchase the Eventide voice/call logging system as a replacement for the current system. The new system would be purchased from Northland and Companies at a cost of \$17,490. Funds for the purchase will come from the 911 budget. Commissioner Larson made a motion to approve the purchase, seconded by Commissioner Mark Titera. Motion carried.

Stuart Lien, IT Director, requested authorization to purchase two key card controllers for the basement IT storage room and the IT office. These would be purchased from Gar-

gen Valley Technologies at a cost of \$5,941.75. Funds for the purchase would come from the 911 budget. Commissioner Ramsrud made a motion to approve the purchase, seconded by Commissioner Titera. Motion carried. Lien requested approval of the County's email retention policy. The commissioners approved the policy effective March 11, 2025. Next, Lien discussed the need to enter into a contract with MNCCC for Aumentum Hosting of the Aumentum Platform Tax System as required by the state. The cost is \$60,000 annually for hosting and a one-time set-up fee of \$15,000. Commissioner Larson made the motion to approve, seconded by Commissioner Ramsrud. Motion carried.

Lori Lewis, Board Coordinator, filled in for Allen Paulson, Auditor/Treasurer, who was unable to attend the meeting. A resolution was submitted to remember with honor former Clearwater County Recorder, Marlys Blooflat, who was elected and served the residents of Clearwater County from January 1, 1990, to December 31, 1999, with a moment of silence in respect to her recent death on February 19, 2025. A motion to approve the resolution was made by Commissioner Ramsrud, seconded by Commissioner Titera. Motion carried. After reviewing the bills to be paid, Commissioner Titera made a motion to authorize the County Auditor to pay the submitted invoices of \$135,276.08 to be paid from the County Revenue Fund and \$17,515.57 from the Public Health Fund. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Dukek. Motion carried.

Dan Sauvé, County Engineer, submitted bills to be paid for the Highway Department totaling \$52,688.10 which were approved. Next were Engineer's Certificates of Performance for CP-24-200 and CP 24-600. Both were approved and Sauve was authorized to make final payment to Vogt Dirt Services for both projects. Sauvé also requested approval to hire Thomas Morinville for the Engineering Technician II position at

the salary of Grade 16, step 5 as identified in the IUOE Local 49 Union contract. Commissioner Ramsrud made the motion to approve the hire, seconded by Commissioner Dukek. Motion carried with Commissioner Titera abstaining. The final item of business was the opening of bids for CP 25-100 (pavement markings). There were three bidders with Sir Lines a Lot submitting the low bid. After reviewing the bids, Sauvé will bring his final recommendation to the next board meeting.

With no further items on the agenda, the meeting was adjourned at 10:17 am. The next Board of Commissioners meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, March 11th at 10 am.

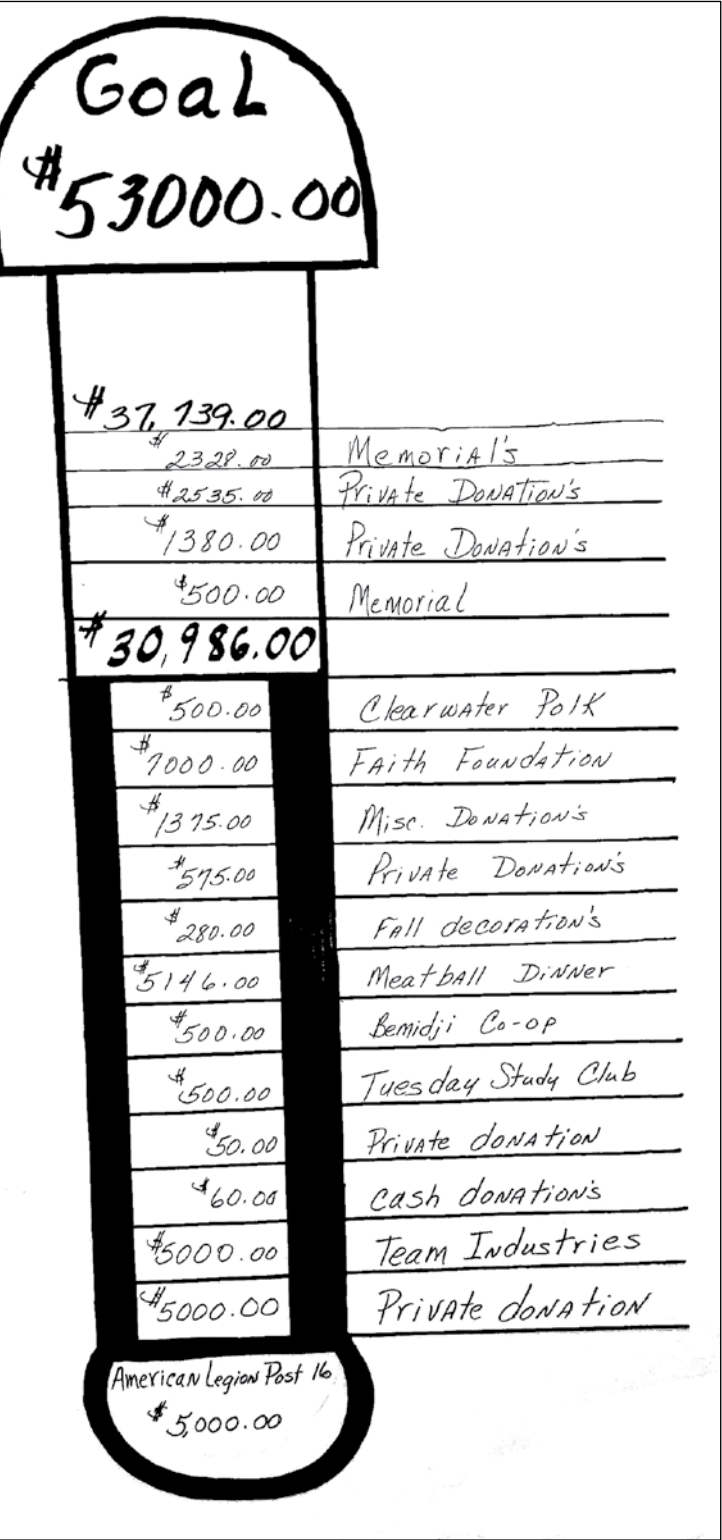
