Deadline to remove ice shelters in northern MN is March 20th

Keep lakes clean by removing all litter left on the lakes.

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources reminds anglers the upcoming deadline to remove ice shelters from lakes in the northern one-third of the state is quickly approaching.

Heavy snow and slush in some areas means conditions on the ice might be challenging, so the DNR urges anglers to plan ahead to ensure they're able to meet the deadline.

The removal deadline in the northern one-third of the state — which is defined as north of the east-west line formed by U.S. Highway 10, east along Highway 34 to Minnesota Highway 200, east along Highway 200 to U.S. Highway 2, and east along Highway 2 to the Minnesota-Wisconsin border — is 11:59 p.m. Monday, March 20.

McIntosh Council hears from residents about chickens

The McIntosh City Council met with residents on Thursday, March 9th at the Community Center on the subject of allowing backyard chickens in the City.

Most of the residents who attended the meeting were pro the modification of City Ordinances to allow residents to keep and raise chickens for personal use inside the City limits.

Though the Council members did voice that they all have heard from many members of the community, who were not present, that they did not agree with allowing chickens inside the city limits, there was even a letter from a concerned citizen who was unable to attend the meeting.

The City Council's concerns mirrored most municipalities that have debated this issue.

The concerns arise from the fact that if chicken keeping is not done well, the risk of animal suffering and human disease is significant.

The biggest risk (ironically, also the biggest benefit) to keeping urban chickens is the general ignorance people have of chickens. What do chickens need to eat to be healthy? What temperature should the coop be able to maintain for the birds comfort and health? How can one dispose of the average 2 pounds of manure per chicken per week? What should I do with my chickens in the winter?

If the City allows such an enterprise, they implicitly assume some of the responsibility for what happens when their

ordinances are followed with very limited resources.

If complaints come in for chickens freezing to death in a poorly made coop, the City Council will be asked why they permit that to happen. If someone gets very ill, or, heaven forbid, dies from food borne illness from backyard eggs, fingers will point towards City hall. If there is a family of children that get sick from playing in the backyard amongst the manure of hens, well, you get the idea.

So, the challenge that the City of McIntosh is facing is developing a ordinance and a method of policing it that makes it impossible for people to cause themselves or their hens undue stress.

The ordinance also has to deal with keeping vermin and wildlife to a minimum, planning for the disposition of manure, chicken containment and dealing with residents who do not follow the laws concerning keeping and raising their chickens, all with limited resources to enforce any and all backyard chicken operations.

The residents that were present were well educated on the keeping and care of backyard chickens and would probably be successful. But allowing these residents chickens also means allowing all city residents the same option to



raise chickens.

If approved by the City Council, there would be strict licensing procedures and permits to those who follow the ordinances.

Chickens would not be allowed to be kept without a permit in any way.

Currently the Ordinance, Chapter 91.04 states that Farm animals shall only be kept in an agricultural district of the city or on a residential lot of at least ten (10) acres in size provided that no animal shelter be within 300 feet of an adjoining piece of property. Farm animals are defined as any animals commonly associated with a farm or performing work in an agricultural setting. Unless otherwise defined, farm

animals shall include members of the equines family, bovine family, sheep, poultry, fowl, swine (including Vietnamese pot-bellied pigs), goats, bees, ratitae (ostriches and emus), farm raised cervidae (caribous and mule deer), llamas and alpacas and other animals associated with a farm, ranch or stable.

The McIntosh City Council will revisit the request during the April 2023 Council meeting, after the members of the Council are able to research further and consider the information that was presented to them by community members.

Talking potholes with U of M

While the end of winter brings warmer temperatures and green grass, it also heralds the beginning of one of the most difficult times of year for drivers: pothole season.

Manik Barman, Ph.D., an associate professor in the Swenson College of Science and Engineering at the University of Minnesota Duluth and a scholar with the Center for Transportation Studies, discusses what causes potholes, the work that goes into fixing them and how drivers can stay safe on uneven roads.

Q: What causes potholes?
Barman: Minnesota's roads experience harsh weather conditions. Severely cold temperatures, heavy snowfall, freeze-thaw cycles and de-icing salt significantly influences the roads of Minnesota.

In general, potholes are secondary distress, mostly the end result of other structural distresses caused by traffic load or material weathering. In areas similar to Minnesota, the weather plays the dominant role especially for moderate and low-volume roads. The water that infiltrates the pavement structure transforms into ice in the winter and creates micro-cracks in the asphalt layer. In the spring when the ice thaws, those cracks propagate and disintegrate the asphalt materials under the vehicle load and create potholes.

Early detection catches colorectal cancer

Jessica Bye has always been active, whether she's enjoying the outdoors, playing volleyball or – her favorite pastime – cheering on her youngest at local sporting events.

When she started feeling unusually tired last spring, she figured it was probably due to her busy lifestyle as a single mom. But something also just felt "off."

Jessica made an appointment with her primary care provider at the Essentia Health-South University Clinic. Nurse practitioner Joe Halvorson ran tests and ordered a computed tomography – or CT – scan.

The CT scan revealed a shadow in her colon, identified as a sizable mass during a colonoscopy. A colonoscopy is a procedure in which a fiber-optic scope with a camera is inserted into the colon to look for polyps and other growths.

Despite not having a family history of cancer, 44-year-old Jessica was diagnosed with stage three colorectal cancer.

She immediately started chemotherapy and radiation treatments, followed by a colectomy, or bowel-resection surgery, in mid-August to remove the tumor and affected lymph

The loss of support underneath the asphalt layer for melting ice and the effect of de-icing salt, age and condition of the pavement have effects on the pothole formation, propagation and severity.

Q: How are potholes patched?

Barman: Potholes require rapid repair action for the safety of road users. Different patching methods and materials are available. In the winter, potholes are temporarily patched using a cold mix until more permanent patching methods can be applied. Patching with hot mixes is generally performed in non-winter seasons. Conventional asphalt mixes, slurry mixes and mastic patching materials are used.

Q: Have the methods used to patch roads changed over the past few

nodes.

An ileostomy bag was created to help serve as a temporary part of her colon, followed by additional treatment to prevent future growths.

This past January, Jessica's colon was reconnected – and she is cancer-free.

"I never even realized before this happened to me how crazy it is and how lucky I am that I got it diagnosed when I did," emphasizes Jessica. "I mean, I could have waited for something to actually feel seriously wrong, as I felt like my symptoms were so easily explained."

Jessica's main message to others is simple: "Go get your regular screenings. Don't ignore them. Don't ignore your body."

From her chemotherapy nurses to her surgeon, Dr. David Stover, Jessica is thankful for the care she received at Essentia. About Halvorson, her primary care provider, she says, "He's the guy where it all started. I owe him big."

Jessica continues her road to full recovery, remains in contact with the Essentia Health Cancer Center team and has a follow-up later this spring.

decades? If so, what innovations have been made?

Barman: In recent years, innovations have been made in both methods and materials. On-site patching material mixers and installation equipment have been made to produce hot asphalt-based patching mixes, which can now be used in the winter as well. Equipment is available to heat the existing materials around the pothole which enhances the bonding of the existing asphalt material to the patching material, leading to a better service life. Among the new patching materials, UMD's taconite-based patching material is a fast-setting patching material that can last significantly longer, and can be applied more easily in winter.

Q: What do you think Minnesotans should know – but might not already – when it comes to potholes?

Barman: Driving on pothole-infested roads is frustrating and hazardous. This is why transportation agencies take initiative to mitigate pot-

holes, including implementing preventive maintenance and periodical repair works. However, it is safe to assume that the harsh weather conditions – especially the freeze-thaw cycle – will keep creating potholes.

The following are some tips for handling potholes this spring: Expect potholes and drive slowly and cautiously; Consider scheduling in extra driving time; Watch for vehicle damage after driving on potholes; Report pothole occurrences to transportation agencies (city, county and/or MnDOT District as appropriate) as soon as possible; Try to keep calm when dealing with road difficulties, remembering that we live in an area that has harsh weather which impacts the roads.

Q: What work are you doing to advance road maintenance techniques and technology?

Barman: "Better roads" is the theme of my research. I conduct research on creating innovative and sustainable pavement materials and designs, rehabilitation and maintenance. The pothole patching guide and decision framework

I developed is currently used in Minnesota to select the most-effective patching method as a function of the season, shape and size of the potholes. Agencies now have flash cards to select the appropriate patching method based on the pothole features. In another research, I determined the most cost-effective pavement crack sealing method for Minnesota roads, which is awaiting implementation. Appropriate sealing of cracks can decrease the moisture infiltration to the pavement structure, which can negate the effect of freeze-thaw cycles that creates potholes. One of my recent projects focuses on developing better-performing asphalt mixtures for low-volume roads in Minnesota to decrease weather-induced distresses.

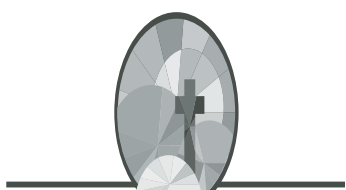

Attack on gun rights moves forward

We have seen numerous harmful Democrat bills moving at lighting speed this legislative session, but among the most alarming are a series of gun control bills that go far beyond what we've seen in recent years.

Two of the DFL's highest priorities this session include bills that close so-called "loopholes" using background checks and "red flag" reporting. House File (HF) 14 would require all private transfers of firearms to include a background check and imposes burdensome record keeping requirements backed up by a criminal penalty if those records are lost or destroyed, even up to 20 years later.

The DFL's "red flag law", HF 15, would allow courts to prohibit people from possessing firearms if anyone on a long list of people reports that the person could be a significant danger to themselves or others.

On top of their two priority gun control bills, the DFL has also been holding hearings on other bills that would burden lawful gun owners unnecessarily. Recently, Democrats on the

House Public Safety Committee passed HF 396 and HF 601.

The first bill imposes burdensome requirements on how gun owners are allowed to store their guns, including a requirement that guns be stored unloaded and in a separate safe from their ammunition, and establishes criminal penalties

if these requirements are not followed.

The second establishes a duty to report a stolen or lost firearm to law enforcement within 48 hours, and establishes criminal penalties for a failure to report within that time frame.

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State exports reach record high: \$27 Billion in 2022, up 16% over 2021

Value of Minnesota exports continued to increase for a second year, showing ongoing rebound from pandemic disruptions.

Minnesota exports of agricultural, mining and manufactured products reached a record high of \$27 billion in 2022, according to a report released today by the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development (DEED). The state's exports continued their growth streak from 2021, jumping 16% over the year.

"Minnesota's record export sales and continued export growth are great news. These trends show that our manufacturers are well-positioned in international markets and contribute strongly to resilience in our state economy," said interim DEED Commissioner Kevin McKinnon. "We will continue to engage in multi-faceted efforts to bring Minnesota companies and goods to the global stage."

"The Minnesota Trade Office is committed to helping small and medium-sized Minnesota companies navigate international markets," said Gabrielle Gerbaud, Executive Director of the Minnesota Trade Office.

"We invite all Minnesota companies looking to launch or grow export sales to utilize all the resources our office provides."

North American markets drove Minnesota's export growth in 2022. Minnesota exports to North America grew to nearly \$12 billion, jumping by 30% over 2021. Exports also strongly performed to the European Union (up 26%), the Caribbean, Central America and South America (up 22%) and the Middle East (up 30%), but fell to Asia (down 2%).

Individual national markets gaining over \$150 million in exports from the state in 2022 included Canada (up \$2.3 billion), Mexico (up \$349 million), the Netherlands (up \$239 million), Korea (\$794 million, and

Application now open for new MDA continuous living cover grant

Online applications due by April 13, 2023.

The Minnesota Department of Agriculture (MDA) is now accepting applications for a new grant to develop enterprises, supply chains, and markets for continuous living cover crops and cropping systems in the early stage of commercial development.

Continuous living cover (CLC) refers to agricultural systems in which there are living plants and roots in the ground throughout the entire year.

This can take many forms, from winter cover crops sown between summer annuals to agroforestry practices, perennial forage crops, perennial biomass crops, and perennial grain production. This includes but is not limited to regenerative poultry silvopasture systems, Kernza® perennial grain, winter camelina, and elderberry.

This one-time funding is provided to the MDA by the Minnesota Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund as recommended by the Legislative-Citizen Commission on Minnesota Resources (LCC-MR).

CLC crops have been shown to enhance water and soil quality, sequester carbon, build soil health, and provide greater biodiversity and pollinator habitat. Significant environmental benefits of these crops will result from widespread production, which requires robust value chains and markets.

The goal is to provide grants to CLC crops and cropping systems value chain enterprises for equipment infrastructure and business and market development. For example, this could include customized equipment to harvest the crop, clean and store seeds, and process crops for food products. The intended outcome is supply chain and market development that can increase CLC crops and cropping systems

\$211 million) and Spain (up \$158 million).

Among products, surging global sales of mineral fuel, oil (up \$1.8 billion), electrical equipment (up \$681 million) and cereals (up \$618 million) contributed the most to Minnesota's export gains in 2022. Mineral fuel, oil exports doubled to \$3.6 billion – propelled by Canada and petroleum products. High-growth markets for electrical equipment included Canada (up 38%), Germany (up 49%) and Singapore (up 50%); while those for cereals included Canada – the primary market for cereals – as well as emerging markets for wheat such as Yemen and Indonesia.

Minnesota conducted \$70 billion in total trade in goods with 215 countries in 2022. Total trade grew 25% since 2021. With nearly \$43 billion in imports (up 31%), the state ran a trade deficit of about \$15 billion in 2022.

U.S. exports overall grew 18% between 2021 and 2022. Minnesota ranked 21st highest in exports among the 50 states for total exports, up from 22nd in 2021. The state's exports of goods supported about 118,000 Minnesota jobs in 2021.

Additional export details can be found in the 2022 annual report, which is posted on DEED's website in the Exports and Trade Statistics section.

The Minnesota Trade Office (MTO) supports small- and medium-sized Minnesota businesses through technical assistance, export education and training programs, trade promotion activities, services by offices in strategic overseas locations, and export expansion grants. State Trade and Export Promotion (STEP) grants – 50% matching, up to \$7,500 – support a range of export development activities, including participation in virtual and in-person trade shows and missions. The MTO also helps foreign companies explore the advantages of expanding or relocating in Minnesota, and

on agricultural lands in Minnesota.

Applicants must:

- Be an organization in Minnesota, including a company, government, tribe, urban American Indian Community, partnership, and any type of civil or political association of people.
- Focus on continuous living cover.

The MDA anticipates awarding approximately \$420,000 using a competitive review process. The maximum award is \$50,000, and the minimum award is \$10,000.

The Developing Markets for CLC Crops Grant application must be received by 3 p.m. on Thursday, April 13, 2023, through the MDA's online application system. Decisions are expected in early May.

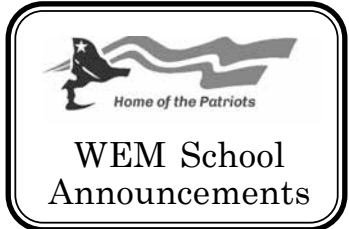
Did you know?

Though plants might not seem like the first thing individuals think of when they ponder long-term investments, perennials can be just that. The home and garden experts at HGTV note that some perennials can live for a very long time.

For example, according to HGTV, the colorful flowering plant peony, despite a blooming season that usually lasts just seven to 10 days, has been known to survive for 70 to 100 years.

Hostas are another popular perennial because they require little maintenance, and that extra free time can add up over the course of the hosta's life, which can exceed 15 years. Long-living perennials are not necessarily unusual, but gardeners should know that many perennials, and particularly those characterized as "short-lived," tend to live around three years.

The Art of Addiction: An exhibit featuring the art of NW MN artists

The Northwest Minnesota Arts Council (NWMAC) is pleased to announce the opening of our latest exhibit -- The Art of Addiction. This exhibit is open through Friday, April 28 at the NWMAC Gallery at Northland Community and Technical College in Thief River Falls.

The exhibit features ceramic art by Roseau Potter Kate Hammer and other pieces of art by NW Minnesota artists around the theme of addiction. Kate Hammer explained, "For me this exhibit symbolizes healing and growth as an artist and a person living in recovery." Other artists with work in the exhibit are Courtney Olson of Crookston, Mara Hanel of Warren, and Karrie Taie of Roseau.

In addition, there are 9 12 x12 canvas paintings included in the exhibit that were created in a workshop with residents of the Northwestern Apartments transitional living facility in Crookston. Mike Anderson, who manages the apartments stated, "For those who have struggled with mental health and substance use problems in their life, recovery is a sometimes long and arduous path. Often it can literally be a life and death struggle. Residents of the Northwestern Apartment

Studies show that children are more successful in school and life if given a strong foundation in the earliest years of their lives.

A screening is a simple appointment used to identify infants and young children at risk for potential health, developmental, or social-emotional problems.

Screening helps identify children who need more evaluation and addresses concerns early before they become bigger problems.

"Screens give parents piece of mind that their child is on the right track," shared Erin Jore, CCC-SLP and Speech Therapy coordinator at RiverView. "It's a time when the therapist can give parents ideas and strategies to promote development. If needed, we can also refer the child to other great early childhood resources in our community."

The screening process creates an opportunity for parents to learn more about developmental milestones so they know what to look for as their children grow. Conducted consistently, screening provides a benchmark for tracking children's development over time. Intervention and support services provided in early childhood can support children's development and help them to be ready for school.

At RiverView, physical, occupational, and speech therapists screen children in the following areas:

- Gross Motor Skills
- Speech/Language
- Reading and Writing
- Self Help Skills
- Fine Motor Skills
- Social Skills

There are different screening milestones for different ages beginning at birth. Below are a few milestones for children at the age of two:

Speech

- Says 150-200 words, including nouns, verbs, adjectives, and social phrases
- Consistently combines two words to make phrases
- Uses speech to answer easy questions

- Asks simple questions
- Uses words more than gestures/grunts

Physical Therapy

- Runs
- Walks up stairs with one hand held
- Ability to carry large toy while walking
- Can squat during play
- Retrieves toy off of the floor from a standing position
- Can climb onto furniture, turn and sit

Occupational Therapy

- Plays appropriately with toys
- Can remove socks, untie shoes, and pull on pants without help
- Can build a tower of six blocks
- Uses utensils well
- Can unscrew the top of a one-inch or two-inch bottle

Between the ages of four and five, a child should reach the following milestones:

- **Speech**
 - Tells simple stories with sentences of five to eight words

- Understands time concepts (ex: now, soon, later)
- Carries on a simple conversation
- Predicts outcomes or provides explanations
- Uses language to resolve disputes with peers
- Tells what is real and what is make-believe
- Speaks with correct grammar

- Gives descriptions of objects (ex: Tell me about an apple)

Physical Therapy

- Imitates body movements (up to four positions)
- Can complete sit-ups
- Is able to complete a somersault
- Gallops

Occupational Therapy

- Puts on socks
- Pulls pants on/off
- Colors in between the lines
- Uses a scissor to cut simple shapes (circle, square)
- Cares for self at the toilet (after a bowel movement)

"If you have any concerns regarding your child's overall development, reach out," Jore urged. "It is always better to intervene sooner than later. Without intervention, your child may be at risk of becoming further delayed. Screens are free and scheduled when it works best for you."

While the Rehab Team commonly offers screening for children from birth to age five, screening is available for patients of any age, Jore reported. Screenings and services are offered at RiverView Rehab locations in Crookston (281.9463), East Grand Forks (773.1390), Fertile (945.5620), and Red Lake Falls (253.4606).



ments (NWA) transitional living facility know that struggle intimately. Many residents come to NWA from inpatient mental health facilities, homeless shelters, substance use programs, and incarceration. Criteria for admission is to have a serious mental illness, and about 3/4 of residents also have a co-occurring substance use disorder. But whether it is stabilizing mental health symptoms, or the daily challenge to stay clean and sober, recovery is the goal of all. Inclusion in this art therapy project, The Art of Addiction,

was a great way for residents to "go deeper." After an initial session with local artist Trey Everett, the residents engaged with supplies and canvas to work on their own creation, with the general theme of addiction and recovery as a guide. Residents spent a week with their art. Many did several art pieces. Some were unable to finish one. Others felt their art was too personal to put on display. The project was captivating – residents were in the community room, sometimes alone, sometimes in groups, at all times of the day and night,

working on their art, talking, and healing. One of the keys to recovery is connection, and this project provided that in addition to a personal and therapeutic experience that helped all involved on their healing path."

NOTICE OF DELINQUENT TAXES

TO: ALL PERSONS WITH A LEGAL INTEREST IN THE PARCELS OF REAL PROPERTY DESCRIBED IN THE FOLLOWING DELINQUENT TAX LIST.

A list of real property in Polk County on which delinquent property taxes and penalties are due has been filed with the district court administrator of Polk County. This list is published to inform all persons that the listed property is subject to forfeiture because of delinquent taxes.

The property owner, taxpayer, or other interested persons must either pay the tax and penalty, plus interest and costs, or file a written objection with the district court administrator. The objection must be filed by April 26, 2023, stating the reason why the tax or penalty is not due on the property. If no objection is filed, a court judgement will be entered against the property for the unpaid tax, penalty, interest and costs.

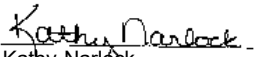
For property under court judgement, the period of redemption begins on May 8, 2023, and ends three years later. The period of redemption means the time within which taxes must be paid to avoid losing the property through forfeiture.

You may qualify to enter into a confession of judgement as an alternative method to paying off the delinquent tax amount and avoiding forfeiture. This allows you to pay the delinquent balance in equal annual installments, with a down payment due at the time you enter into the confession. The length of the installment plan varies: five years for commercial-industrial/public utility property; 10 years for all other properties.

It should also be noted by property homesteaders that you are ineligible to receive the Property Tax Refund while you owe delinquent property tax.

To avoid forfeiture, taxes on property must be paid by May 8, 2025.

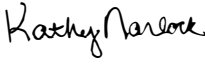
