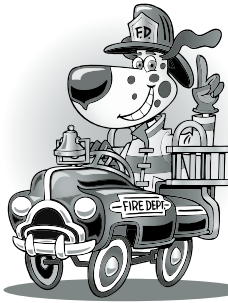
The 19th Annual Winger Fireman's Ball is this Saturday

Continued from page 1 ... realize your body is no longer producing sweat.

Stay hydrated. Come the dog days of summer, keep a water bottle with you at all times, refilling it throughout the day as necessary. The American Heart Association notes that the heart can more easily pump blood through blood vessels to the muscles when it is hydrated. Dehydration reduces the body's ability to sweat and maintain a normal body temperature, so stay hydrated on hot days by drinking water throughout the day.

Make cool dietary choices. When planning meals on hot days, choose light foods and opt for small portions so you aren't fighting feelings of sluggishness that can compound any heat-related feelings of listlessness you're already coping with. In addition, choose meals that don't require you to turn on the oven.

The dog days of summer are often marked by humidity and blazing sun. Overcoming those factors may require altering certain habits.

Goss's Bacterial Wilt and Leaf Blight

With the recent winds and hail, warm temperatures, and the continued number acres of corn grown in Northwestern Minnesota, there probably is a good chance that we'll see more fields with Goss's Wilt infections. It's important to be scouting for this disease, identify such fields, and then take appropriate action by rotations and hybrid selection for future years. Below is some information on Goss's Wilt provided by Dean Malvick, U of M Extension plant pathologist.

Fundamentals: This corn disease was first confirmed in Minnesota in 2009 and is now widespread in corn production areas of the state. It also occurs in the bordering states of North and South Dakota, Iowa, Wisconsin, and in Manitoba. Although it may have occurred earlier in some areas, it has been a spreading problem. Yield losses from Goss's wilt and blight can exceed 30% for susceptible hybrid.

Conditions and timing that favor this disease: Goss's wilt primarily infects leaves that have been wounded, such as by hail, sand-blasting, rain, wind, and strong storms. The disease spreads in the plant following leaf infection, and can spread from plant to plant. Disease development is favored by warm (>80°F) conditions. Symptoms often become most visible and increase in severity after silking. The disease is favored by planting susceptible hybrids, reduced tillage, and planting corn-on-corn.

Causal Pathogen: Goss's wilt is caused by the bacterial pathogen named *Clavibacter michiganensis* subspecies *nebraskensis*. It overwinters in infested corn debris near the soil surface. The pathogen can possibly be seed transmitted at very low levels. Grain sorghum and some grasses such as sudan, several foxtail species,

shattercane, and eastern gamma grass are also susceptible to this pathogen.

Symptoms and Diagnosis of Goss's wilt: The primary symptoms on leaves are elongated tan lesions with irregular margins extending parallel to the veins. Large sections of leaf area can be affected. Dark, water-soaked spots ("freckles") develop in the lesions. Shiny patches of dried bacterial ooze that appear similar to dry varnish are often present on the lesions. In plants with stalk infection, orange vascular bundles may be seen in the stalk. The seedling blight phase of this disease may cause wilting and death of seedlings, but is not common in Minnesota. Confirmatory diagnosis is based on the presence of characteristic symptoms and signs on leaves, bacterial streaming from lesions seen with a microscope, and confirmation of the presence of the bacterial pathogen.

Management of Goss's wilt: This disease can be managed by using resistant hybrids, rotating away from corn production, using tillage that buries corn residue after harvest, and by controlling grassy weeds.

Aug. 1 deadline for ARC and PLC programs

USDA Reminds Minnesota Producers of Aug. 1 Deadline to Enroll in Agriculture Risk Coverage and Price Loss Coverage Programs

U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Minnesota Farm Service Agency (FSA) Executive Director, Grant Herfindahl reminds farmers and ranchers that they have until Aug. 1 to enroll in Agriculture Risk Coverage (ARC) and/or Price Loss Coverage (PLC) programs for the 2016 crop year.

"Producers have already elected ARC or PLC, but they must enroll for the 2016 crop year by signing a contract before the Aug. 1 deadline to receive program benefits," said Herfindahl. "Producers are encouraged to contact their local FSA office to schedule an appointment to enroll."

The programs trigger financial protections for participating agricultural producers when market forces cause substantial drops in crop prices or

revenues. Nationwide, more than 1.76 million farmers and ranchers are expected to sign contracts to enroll in ARC or PLC. Covered commodities include barley, canola, large and small chickpeas, corn, crambe, flaxseed, grain sorghum, lentils, mustard seed, oats, peanuts, dry peas, rapeseed, long grain rice, medium grain rice (which includes short grain and sweet rice), safflower seed, sesame, soybeans, sunflower seed and wheat.

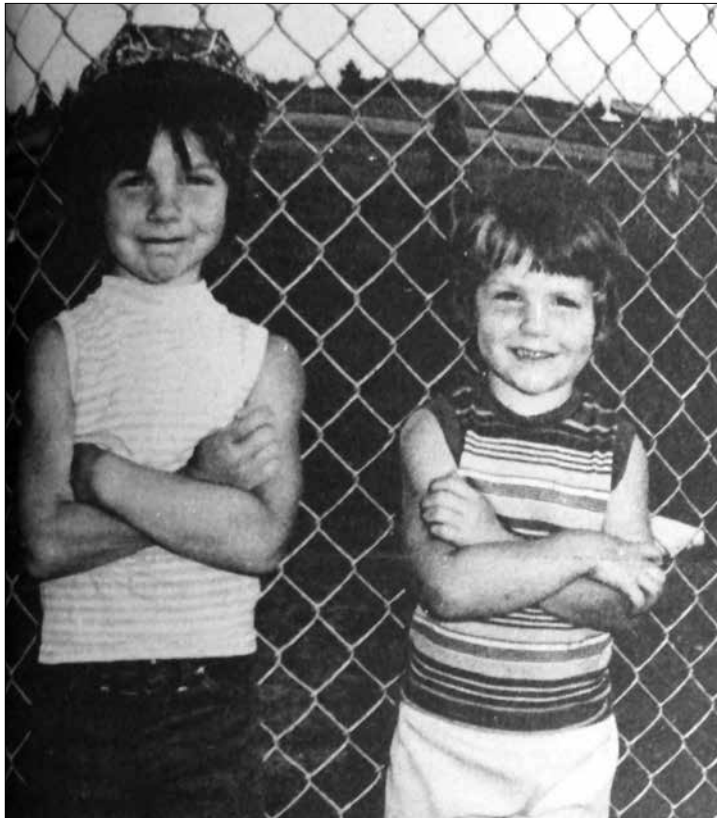

McIntosh: the Town and the Man (Part 3)
A jog in the road

In 1898 the railroad line had been extended from Fosston to Duluth. The rail traffic increased and the iron rails were replaced with steel. With the increase in railway transportation, the town of McIntosh continued to grow and develop during the last two years of the 1890's. Five elevators were built to take in grain crops. According to C.T. Lanman, "lines of grain teams a half mile long, waiting to un-

load." Stores, hotels, livery, feed barns and saloons lined the streets. In 1890 a flour mill was in full operation. The community of McIntosh was also the hub of the trade industry for 35 miles to the northeast as well as reaching nearly as far in several other directions.

With expansion came a new survey of the city which led to a dispute that resulted in the newer parts of town being platted north and south with "compass accuracy." The original townsite "remained parallel with and at a 90 degree angle from the railroad tracks." Due to the errors in the original survey, the town eventually split with what became known as North McIntosh being platted on the Ole Lee forty north-east of the school house. The Austin addition was platted south of the railroad tracks while the Johnson and McIn-

tosh properties were in the original townsite. Differing opinions, political and otherwise, added to the friction over the corrected survey of the original site.

The dispute lead to the moving of the Johnson and Stovern Brothers stores and the establishment of North McIntosh. The original townsite was actually owned by S.P. Johnson, A.J. McIntosh and Knute Austin. The survey was done by George Ralph of Crookston.

"The dispute left a permanent 'kink' in the town's main business section with Cleveland Avenue becoming Broadway at the jog."

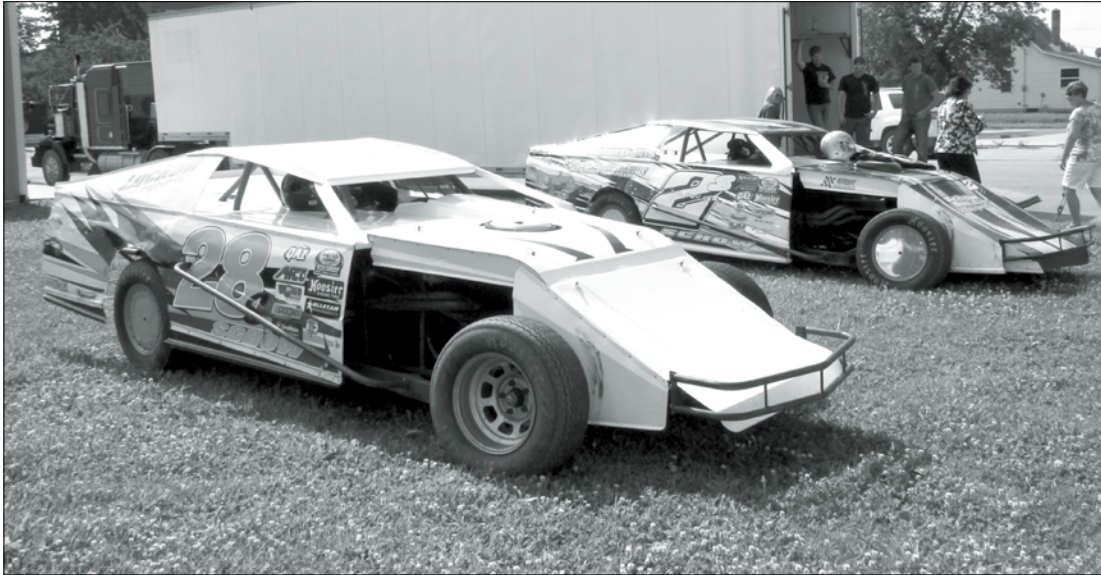
