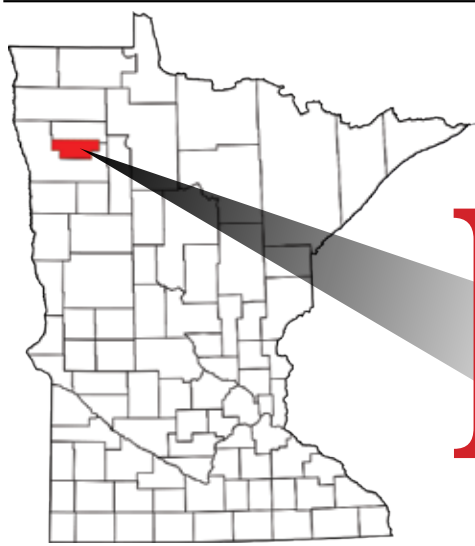

Red Lake County Rebels Head to State!



On Friday night, March 14th, the Red Lake County Rebels took on the Kittson County Central Bearcats and won their place at the State Tournaments in Minneapolis on March 20th. The final score was 68-40.

REBELS OFF TO STATE!

I was lucky and happy to be at the Ralph Engelstad Arena (with most of the communities of RLF, Oklee, Plummer and Brooks!), Friday, March 14th, to watch our hometown RLC Rebels take on the KCC Bearcats in the Section Championship game. After a somewhat sluggish first half the Rebel Boys dominated the 2nd half marching on to a victory, by a score of 68-40. At one point the Rebels went on a 21-0 run in that 2nd half! Basketball is often a game of runs and that run put a nail or two into the coffin for KCC giving the Rebels a berth in the State Tournament!

The Bearcats led 28-25 at the half, but to start the second half, the hot hand of Ethan Majeres nailed a three pointer to tie the game. The teams battled back and forth before the Rebels hot shooting let them run away from the Bearcats! Ethan Majeres hot three point shooting and great defense from the Rebels team helped lead to a great celebration! Connor Duden had the task of guarding KCC standout Ty Vig, not an easy task. But Duden's defense held down KCC's offensive attack helping lead the Rebels on to victory.

I mentioned hot shooting for the Rebels. They ended the



game with 13 three pointers, 6 coming from senior Ethan Majeres. At the close of the game when the awards ceremony began the Rebels student section began chanting MVP... MVP... MVP as Majeres accepted his medal!

As usual the Rebels had a balanced attack and their team effort led them to this great accomplishment of a State Tournament Birth. Connor Duden let the Rebels with 20, Ethan Majeres with 18 (six three-pointers!), Will Gieseke 13, Owen Chervestad 7, Ethan Johnson 4, Luke Peterson 2, Thor Thomson 2, Benji Brammer 2. The Rebels will advance to playing at the Target Center at 5:00PM on Thursday, March 20, vs The Goodhue Wildcats who represent Region 1A.

Red Lake County Commissioner's Minutes

February 25, 2025

Pursuant to adjournment of its last meeting, the Red Lake County Board of Commissioners duly met in regular session at the Courthouse in Red Lake Falls, MN on February 25, 2025, at 10:00 am.

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Flage called the meeting to order. Commissioners present: Chuck Flage, Al Remick, Eric Mickelson, Tony Gerardy and Andy Moran. Others present: Kurt Casavan, Taylor Amiot, Angie Lundeen, Melissa Sletten and Kelsey Gervais. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Commissioner Mickelson moved, seconded by Commissioner Remick and carried unanimously to approve the agenda.

ENVIRONMENTAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

Environmental Officer Kurt Casavan reviewed various options and costs for the Red Lake Falls and Oklee Landfill sites, including a Hydro-geologic Study with Permit Renewal or Closure Plans through a Permit By Rule Application. He also informed the board that a Teams meeting has been scheduled for March 4, 2025, at 8:30 AM with Senator Mark Johnson and the MPCA. Commissioners Remick and Mickelson, along with Casavan, will be in attendance.

HIGHWAY ANNOUNCEMENTS

Highway Engineer Taylor Amiot requested approval for the CSAH 1 Bypass Easements for agricultural land at a rate of \$4,725 per acre for permanent easements and \$472.50 per acre for temporary easements along with an additional triangulation severance for parcel 3 per the appraisal. Amiot also proposed the City parcels at a rate of \$0.66 per square foot for permanent easements and \$0.06 per square foot for temporary easements. Commissioner Gerardy moved to approve the easement costs as presented, with Commis-

sioner Mickelson seconding the motion. Motion carried.

HR ANNOUNCEMENTS

Humar Resource Director, Angie Lundeen met with the board to request an annual wage step increase for herself. Commissioner Mickelson moved, seconded by Commissioner Moran, and carried unanimously to approve the step increase.

MINUTES

Commissioner Gerardy moved, seconded by Commissioner Remick, and carried unanimously to approve the minutes from the meeting on February 11, 2025.

EXPENDITURES

Commissioner Remick moved, seconded by Commissioner Mickelson, and carried unanimously to approve the expenditures totaling \$37,833.67 for the period. A complete list is available in the Auditor's office or on the County's website.

On the morning of 03/07/25, Davis Joshua Forst (28) of Badger was cited for speeding on Hwy. #59 north of Brooks.

On the afternoon of 03/07/25, the Security State Bank in Oklee reported they received a counterfeit bill. That report is still under investigation.

On the afternoon of 03/07/25, the Red Lake County Sheriff's Office received a report of a theft of property from a Red Lake Falls residence. That report remains under investigation.

On the evening of 03/08/25, a Red Lake Falls resident reported some cash had been stolen from their residence. That investigation is ongoing.

On the afternoon of 03/10/25, a Red Lake County deputy responded to a report of a disturbance at a Red Lake Falls apartment building. They found that two adult males had a verbal altercation, but no crimes had been committed. One of the parties involved had left prior to the deputy's arrival. The deputy spoke with both parties, and they agreed to stay away from each other for the rest of the night.

On the evening of 03/10/25, the Red Lake County Sheriff's Office received a report of a disturbance at an Oklee residence. Red Lake County deputies responded and found that two adult siblings had an argument. One of them had left before the deputies arrived. Deputies spoke with both of the parties involved, one agreed to stay at a friend's house for the night and the situation was mediated.

In the early morning hours of 03/11/25, a Red Lake County deputy found a ring in the Cenex Parking lot in Brooks. If anyone thinks it may be theirs, they can contact the Sheriff's Office.

On 03/11/25, the Mahnomen County Sheriff's Office reported they had arrested Anthony Randal Ashley Villebrun (46) of Ogema. They indicated that Mr. Villebrun was at the jail in Crookston. Red Lake County held an active misdemeanor warrant for his arrest. Red Lake County place a hold on him and he appeared in Court in Red Lake Falls on 03/12/25, and was released from the Red Lake County warrant and he

was scheduled to appear in Court in Red Lake Falls again on 04/23/25.

On the afternoon of 03/12/25, the Red Lake County Sheriff's Office received a report of a dog running loose in the city of Red Lake Falls. A Red Lake County deputy found the dog. The owner was located, and the dog was returned.

On the afternoon of 03/12/25, Jaye Allan Pyatte (33) of Red Lake Falls was arrested for violating the terms of his supervised probation. He was taken to jail in Crookston.

On the afternoon of 03/12/25, Wade Michael Peterson (33) of Red Lake Falls was arrested for violating an existing harassment restraining order. He violated the order by having contact with the protected person the previous night in Red Lake Falls. He was taken to jail in Crookston. Mr. Peterson appeared in Court in Crookston on 03/12/25 and he was released from custody on his promise to abide by court-ordered conditions.

On the evening of 03/13/25, a Red Lake County deputy was dispatched to Plummer because some young kids were riding around on a golf cart. The deputy located the suspects, counseled them, and sent them home.

NOTICE OF DELINQUENT TAXES
STATE OF MINNESOTA
COUNTY OF RED LAKE

TO: ALL PERSONS WITH A LEGAL INTEREST IN THE PARCELS OF REAL PROPERTY DESCRIBED IN THE FOLLOWING DELINQUENT LIST

A list of real property in Red Lake County on which delinquent property taxes and penalties are due has been filed with the District Court Administrator of Red Lake County. This list is published to inform all persons that the listed property is subject to forfeiture because of delinquent taxes.

The property owner, taxpayer or other interested person must either pay the tax and penalty, plus costs or file a written objection with the District Court Administrator. The objection must be filed by April 15, 2025, stating the reason why the property tax or penalty is not due on the property. If no objection is filed, a court judgement will be entered against the property for the unpaid tax, penalty, interest, and costs.

For property under court judgement, the period of redemption begins on May 12, 2025. The period of redemption means the time within which taxes must be paid to avoid losing the property through forfeiture. The period of redemption is three years, with a handful of exemptions. The redemption period is one year for most properties located in a targeted neighborhood, as defined in the Minnesota laws, and for municipal solid waste disposal facilities. The redemption period is five weeks for certain abandoned or vacant properties.

You may also enter into a confession of judgment as an alternative method to paying off the delinquent tax amount and avoiding forfeiture. This allows you to pay the delinquent balance in equal annual installments with a down payment due at the time you confess judgment. The length of the installment plan varies: 5 years for commercial-industrial/public utility property; 10 years for all other properties.

If you have homesteaded property, you may be eligible for a Senior Citizen's Property Tax Deferral Program under Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 290B. The program provides a deferral of a portion of property taxes through a low-interest loan for property owned and occupied by a person 65 years of age or older when certain qualifications are met.

If your property is classified as a homestead, you may qualify for a Property Tax Refund under Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 290A. The refund provides property tax relief depending on your income and property taxes. An owner of property classified as homestead property is ineligible to receive the Property Tax Refund if property taxes are delinquent.

Information about unencumbered interest in the property may be obtained at your county recorder's office, court administration, or from a real estate title search.

To determine how much interest and costs must be added to pay the tax in full, contact the Red Lake County Auditor's Office, Red Lake County Courthouse, Red Lake Falls, MN 56750. You may also contact the County Auditor's Office at (218)253-2598 or kmgervais@co.red-lake.mn.us.
